### RICHMOND'S CENSUS REPORT.

The very unsatisfactory census report of Richmond, Virginia, showing its increase of population to be only four and one-half per cent, is naturally not merely provoking, but most discouraging to the citizens of that thriving and energetic city.

That this increase of population is so small, is largely due to the real population of Richmond getting beyond its boundaries, hence out of the count.

To every visitor, or person who knows Richmond, this census report can have no effect, for the city shows in its commercial activity, and general up-to-date-ness, a growth during the past decade of which its every citizen can feel proud.

If reckoned commercially, socially or in any other way, Richmond's per cent of increase will make a magnificent showing.

### AVAILABILITY IN POLITICS.

In this day of strenuous politics, it would justly seem that personality should receive more consideration than other attributes, in a political campaign.

The individual entering upon a political campaign, endowed with force of character and known principles, might seem to have enough to warrant personal success, without the question being raised, how much money can be contributed.

This is a characteristic inquiry when a candidate has wealth, and it seems unfortunate that a candidate's personality cannot alone be reckoned with, and his wealth not held first and chiefly to be considered.

For this very reason, the looking beyond the person, and into the possibility of his "barrel," that makes the political field a discouraging place for those endowed with honesty and principles, to enter, with the hope of and special individual success.

It is the availability that is sought in politics, and this very availability "talks" loudest and best for political success, as measured by politicians, when it comes from a "barrel."

The very entry of any man, of any political faith, into the political arena, is the signal for newspaper insinuations that his money is to be at the disposal of his party, in order to further its triumph.

This means the reduction of the man, so far as his personality is concerned, to the zero point, and the action of his wealth, in the degree that it can be available for campaign purposes, is more to be noted and emphasized, than any amount of practical or commonsense speeches he may deliver, from the platform or stump.

It is the old remark revived, that money not only talks, but makes talk.

### THE QUESTION OF COMPULSORY EDUCATION.

The Greensboro Telegram is doing good service for the State's interests in its gathering together and publication of a symposium of the opinions of the leading professional men of North Carolina, on the question of having Compulsory Education in this State.

The matter of education, greater education and more of it, probably concerns more vitally the newspapers, than any other profession.

Education, means more readers for the newspapers, readers who will not merely subscribe and pay for their papers, but demand of the press liberality and freedom of expression.

But aside from this more local view, from a newspaper standpoint, the question of compulsory education is one which deeply concerns every commercial, social and religious interest of the State.

Without thinking, the suggestion of the introduction of compulsion in the matter of education for the youth, is apt to provoke opposition to being an

### Arbitrary, law, one against individual freedom.

And yet with constant legislation and making of laws to govern society and trade on every side, why should there not be legislation to prepare the youth of the State, enforce such a preparation, that it may be more ready to enter the society and trade, for there can be no question of the value of education to the youth entering upon the real and useful duties of life.

Compulsory education is not contrary to any rule of American freedom, where it prevails, and has been tried, it has given greater freedom and strength, and liberating ignorance with its consequences, and giving a higher and better education to the people.

The Legislature's introduction of a subject is a matter of compulsion, and the more it is discussed, the greater the chance of compulsory education, coming a reality in North Carolina.

### LET THE DISSATISFIED PASS ALONG.

And this same protester will buy his goods in other places, and demand the highest price for any produce he may have to sell at home.

The progress of the town is hindered largely by the talk of this dissatisfied person and his like, for their talk will cause every one to hesitate about making improvements, where there seems so little to warrant going ahead in a progressive way.

But to these dissatisfied persons, it ought to be known that there are other towns, perhaps none that can fully meet their full desires, yet they should press along and try to find their city of perfect satisfaction to themselves.

For all the dissatisfied ones, there is always the opportunity to move along to some other place.

Dr. Nansen, who returned from his expedition to the Arctic regions in August, 1896, reported that he left his vessel, the Fram March 11, 1895, in 81 north latitude and he carried the Polar Star to a point 34 1/2 north of the new Siberian Islands. This was a point 160 miles further north than any previous explorer had reached.

The Duke of Abozzo, with his expedition, sailed from Christiania June 12, 1896, and was expected to be gone 18 months.
