Bridges were dynamited, stores burned and the railway property is a mass of ruins. The destruction includes hundreds of wagons which have been burned together with clothing, ammunition, and provisions, such as sugar, coffee, rice and flour. Thousands of tons are still burning

Gen. Pole Carew has secured dozens of locomotives, but most of them are wrecked. The whole of the Selati rallway line is blocked with rolling stock.

In the Crocodile river there are acres of damaged ammunition wagons, limbers dynamite detonators and war stores of other sorts. At Komstipoort, besides burning stores, are hundreds of tons of ammunition, caps, gunpowder and other explosives, ready-fused shells, broken rifles and cannon. The Boers had left standing many tents. Trunks. furniture, provisious and clothing were lying about in every direction.

British officers now say that a police force of \$0,000 men can'do the work of pacification in security. If General Buller and others move and seize the passes. they also say, neither Viljoen, the new. commandant-general, nor Commandant Contze, with the rest of the Boers from Komatipoort, can escape through the mountains toward Lydenburg and Pietersburg. To remain in the low yeldt at this season of the year is death to men and cattle.

Three Feet of Snow.

DESVER, Col., September 25-Dispsiches from various points in the Rocky Mountains show that there has been a heavy suowfall. At Red Mountain, near Oursy, suow is reported three feet deep.

At Leadville there are about two laches of snow on the level. The snow was accompanied by a high wind, which made the weather decidedly disa groeable
