### RALEIGH.

#### Freight Rates Discussed. Auditorium Site Decided. Harris May Get a Short Job. The Flower Show.

RALEIGH, November 14.—The corporation commission met today and took up the matter of freight rates. There were present as representatives of the great systems of railway, J. M. Cull of the Southern, H. M. Emerson of the Atlantic Coast Line and H. W. B. Oliver of the Seaboard Air Line. James Kyle of Wilmington appeared a complainant.

Governor Russell will make an appointment to fill the vacancy in the attorney generalship due to the appointment of Z. V. Walser to be reporter to the Supreme Court. Republicans here express the belief that the Governor will appoint his good friend J. C. L. Harris. The appointive will of course only hold office for two months.

A State official was heard to say that he did not think Walser would be reporter long, as the legislature would change the law so as to make the attorney general the reporter. To this the reply was made that the Supreme Court has repeatedly decided that office is property and cannot be taken away during the term of appointment.

Revenue officers made a raid in Franklin county last night and captured two illicit distilleries.

The site of the auditorium here has at last been selected. It is on South Wilmington street, within 100 yards of the capitol and is 120x188 feet. The price to be paid is \$6000. Bonds are to be issued and an auditorium constructed beneath it there will be stores. It is to seat at least 3500 people.

At the home of Mr. M. T. Norris, here this morning his daughter, Miss Ethel Norris, was united in marriage to Mr. Joe K. Marshall, a son of Rev. M. M. Marshall rector of Christ Church who performed the ceremony. Miss Maude Norris was maid of honor, Dr. Herbert Royster best man.

The session of the Presbyterian Synod here is the 87th. The attendance breaks the record. Rev. Dr. Morton of Wilson is the new moderator. Last night Rev. William Black, the retiring moderator, preached the annual sermon.

The State chartered the Jackson Springs Hotel Company, capital \$23,000. It owns the springs and will build a large hotel there.

### Keeps Same Cabinet.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 13.—President McKinley today announced clearly and forcefully to the members of his Cabinet his desire that they should all remain with him during the four years of his coming administration. His wishes were made known in an extended speech at the Cabinet meeting in the White House today.

Responses were made by all of the members present, and while there were no definite pledges from any of them that they would accept the postoffice thus tendered afresh, there was on the other hand no definite declination.

### Christmas box for Manila.

New York, Nov. 13.—Laden with more than 3,000 Christmas boxes and carrying 900 recruits for the army in the Philippines, the transport Kilpatrick, which was formerly the Atlantic Transport Company's steamer Michigan, began a two months' trip to Manila this afternoon.

As the Kilpatrick was the last ship of the fleet likely to get to Manila by Christmas' the rush to send presents was enormous. Three thousand were sent.

### RALEIGH.

#### The State Treasury Report For Eleven Months.

#### Election State Guard Officers. Refusal to Allow New Freight Classification. N. C. Presbyterian Synod. Fight Against Simmons.

RALEIGH, Nov. 15.—The State treasury today gave out the following statement for the 11 months, ending October 31, of the current fiscal year. Receipts \$1,490,243.35, disbursements \$1,409,211.01. At the beginning of the year there was a balance on hand of \$111,965.41. The present balance is \$111,889.41. This balance is really due to the sale of \$148,308 of 4 per cent bonds. These bonds had been for 15 years held as an investment and the interest on them saved. Years ago a surplus on the interest account was invested in these bonds, with the understanding that they could be sold whenever needed. This year they were needed to pay interest on the 4 per cent debt.

Adjutant general Royster says that on Thanksgiving day the company officers in all the companies of the State Guard will be elected.

There is much pleasure here at the news that P. M. Foxall of New Bern is to be the private secretary to Gov. Aycock. Mr. Foxall was a Democrat and this year the indelible secretary of the Democratic executive council.

The action of the executive commission in refusing to allow the new freight classification made on the 1st of this month by the railroads to be effective in North Carolina was commended. The classification now in force holds good. There was a long list of complaints against the new classification.

Today was an important day of the North Carolina Presbyterian Synod in session here. Rev. Dr. Jordan Temple presented the annual report of the Synod's organization at Virginia Springs. At noon the general number of the delegates to the synod participated in a reunion of the students of Davidson college, at a dinner at the Yarbrough house, where covers were laid for 150.

The news that Senator Pritchard is preparing to fight the seating of J. C. Simmons in the Senate was a surprise to some persons, as it had been thought Senator Butler was to be the prime mover in the matter. Ex-Congressman Thomas Settle, Republican, in an open letter, warns Senator Pritchard to let Mr. Simmons alone. Senator Pritchard is just now in Oregon.

### SETTLE TO PRITCHARD.

#### Tells Him That Any Contest Against Simmons Would Be Useless And Harmful.

Asheville, N. C., Nov. 14, 1900.

Hon. J. C. Pritchard, Marshall, N. C.  
My Dear Senator—Having like yourself, the interest of the Republican party at heart, National and State, I trust that you will not misconstrue the motives prompting me to address you this letter.

The results of the November election speak for themselves, to the intelligent mind I understand from various sources, official and unofficial, that it is the policy of a number of gentlemen composing the Republican organization of this State, through you as Senator, to protest against seating Mr. Simmons when he presents his credentials as Mr. Butler's successor. I am opposed to that policy and hope that you will not give ear to it. I see no good in it to the Republican party or to the State. On what grounds will you object to his being sworn in and ask the reference of his credentials to the Committee on Privileges and Elections? The case of Roberts from Utah is not applicable. You cannot establish anything against Mr. Simmons, personally, that would justify the Senate in refusing him admission. You would therefore have to base your case on political and legal or political legal issues, to-wit: North Carolina had not at the time of the election of the members of the legislature which elected Mr. Simmons United States Senator a republican form of government guaranteed by the Constitution, and therefore said legislature, so elected, had no power to elect a Senator. Suppose you succeed in convincing a majority of the Senate that the contention maintained by the law and the facts, what then? Mr. Aycock would immediately appoint Mr. Simmons to fill the vacancy, and your fight would just have begun. You would, in the language of my lamented friend, Gen. J. M. Leach, only have "entered the vestibule of attack." Could you continue that fight upon the ground that Aycock, the Governor, himself elected under the same law, had no power to appoint a Senator to fill a vacancy? Again, should you succeed, if the United States or State Supreme Court should, upon a contest growing out of any act of the present legislature, sustain such a decision of the Senate, "where, oh, where?" The returns of the November election, as compared with those of the August election, show great gains by the Republican party. The August election and the November election were held under the same law. If we had no republican form of government in August we had none in November. Our laws were the same in each election. If the legislature can be investigated and act as the United States Senate upon the allegation that there existed no republican form of government at the time they were elected to the legislature, and therefore declines to admit the man this legislature has elected to represent the State, have you not gotten the State and the Republican party in a very awkward position? How can you assault the credentials of Mr. Simmons and not assault the credentials of every Congressman from the State, including those of Moody and Blackburn, Republican members from the Eighth and Ninth districts? If the election of either is in violation of the condition of the non-existence of a republican form of government, the same is true with reference to all our National Representatives. You cannot maintain that Moody and Blackburn were elected under a republican form of government and that Simmons, Kintz, Kitchin, Small et al. were elected under a non-republican form of government. I am not Mr. Simmons' champion. I suppose I had as much to do with the opposition to his confirmation as collector of internal revenue as any living man in the State. My opposition was political, and as I was then in a contest for a seat in Congress with Mr. Williams, and Senator Ransom was taking sides with Williams, I made the fight in behalf of the Republican party and to give Senator Ransom something to attend to at home.
