"Want Ad" Hills a Church.

On Dec. 17—the Methodist Church of Austin was held last evening in answer to a want ad. The church was full of girls to attend the service.

"If I were a girl," was the subject of the sermon delivered by the pastor, Rev. A. S. White. He said in part:

"If I were a girl I would seek to be a Christian first, and then a woman. I would like to see a pretty face, form and dress, without the use of paint or powder or artificiality. I would like to have a sound, healthy body, and I would like to be temperate in the use of eatables and drinkables. I would like to have Indian clubs and tennis rackets and less of dance-rackets."

The girls seemed pleased with the sermon.

Folding-Bed Victim.

On Dec. 18—Henry Bonn, a wealthy and retired tobaccoist, who resided with his family at 4808 Langley Avenue, was found dead in a collapsed folding bed by members of his family at 10:30 o'clock last night.

Bonn retired at 9:30 o'clock and nothing unusual was heard by the other members of the family during the hour that followed to indicate that an accident had occurred. He was sixty-eight years of age.

Population of Raleigh.

Raleigh, N. C., Dec. 19. The census of Raleigh taken by the Board of Aldermen was completed today.

The accuracy of the government census is established, there being a gain of only 31 votes by the recount.

The city census shows 8,227 white, 5447 negroes, total 13,674. A large negro exodus is found to have taken place.

New Name for Sing.

Sing Sing, N. Y., Dec. 18. By a unanimous vote the citizens of this place voted to petition the legislature to change the name of the village from Sing Sing to Ossining, which is the name of the town.

To prevent the State prison at Sing Sing from taking on the name of the new town it is proposed to erect a new station at the prison gate and remove the Sing Sing sign to it.

Rich Gold Ore in Colorado.

CRIPPLE CREEK, Col., Dec. 18.—Ore was shown in the hotel, tonight from the Mary Nevins, on Rossland Hill, which ranks with the richest ever found in the camp.

One specimen, two inches in thickness, displays particles of gold as large as a pea, and will assay \$60,000 to the ton.

Red Lights in the Senate.

WASHINGTON, Dec. 18.—The Senate has adopted red lights as signals, and the new display is exciting the interest of the latest visitors.

The occasion for the adoption of red lights was the desire on the part of the Sergeant at Arms of the Senate to meet the convenience of many members of the House. Owing to the fact that the Senate has been of late much of the time in executive session, members of the House who had business at the Senate traveled across the building, only to be refused admission when they had reached the Senate door. Col. Randall thought of a way to save all this unnecessary travel. The main door of the Senate Chamber can be seen from the main door of the House, if visitors are not too numerous. Col. Randall had three electric lights installed in red bulbs placed right over the main door of the Senate. When the Senate is in executive session a doorman turns on the lights in these red lamps. A member of the House who sticks up for the Senate at once sees these red lights and may postpone his visit until the lights are turned off.


