CONFEDERATE REUNION.

To be Held at Wrightsvilel, From August 14th to 17th.

The following general order relative to the assembling of the I nited Confederate Veterans of the State in annual reunion at Wrightsville has been issued at beadquarters by General Carr.

Headquarters N. C. Division, United Confederate Veterans, Durham N. C. July 27th, 1901. General Orders, No. 15.

1. A reunion of the North Carolina Division of the United Confederate Veterans will be held at Wrightsville, N C beginning on the afternoon of Wednes day, the 11th day of August, 1901, and closing on the 17th, at which will be held the annual election of Division and Brigade Commanders, to-wit A Major General and four Brigadier Generals. Only those will be entitled to vote at this election who are duly accredited delegates from camps which are reported by Adjutant General Moorman as having paid their dues. The attention of camp commanders is especially called to this, and they will at once see that their camp dues are paid as required by the constitution of the I nited Confederate

the use of the tents and camp equippage of the State Goord at Wrightaville, which will accommodate about one thousand persons. Each tent is eight feet square, and has a plank floor, and two blankels and there are cooking stoves and utensils sufficient. Cots may be rented for the occasion by those destring them. There are a number of hotels and boarding houses which offer reduced rates for those who may not wish to occupy quarters in the camp Each camp, or delegation, most provide its rations either by carrying them or cooking them in camp.

3. All ex-Confederate soldiers in North Carolina of good standing an cordially layited to this reunion, whether or not they are members of any camp or association. In order, however, to exclinde unworthy persons, every veteran is required to carry with him a certificate from his camp commander, or from the clerk of the Superior court of his county in which there is no camp, certifying that he is a veteran in good standing. A strict compliance with this will be required. No veteran without this certificate will be admitted to the privileges of

4. All the railroads in the State have kindly given a rate of one cents mile in each direction for this occasion.

Tickets will be on sale on the 12th 13th and 14th of August, and are good for one continuous passage until the 24th. The agent at any station will give the exact price of a ticket from his station on application, This rate 1. given to all visitors as well as the veter-BDS.

5. A full attendance of veterane is urged and as many as practicable are rea uested to wear their uniforms. This may be the last opportunity for many to attend a re-union and meet their old canirades, so tally up.

The following is the act which is now a law

O AN ACT TO PREVENT HUNTING ON LANDS IN CRAVEN COUNTY WITHOUT CON-SENIOR OWNER OF LAND.

"The General Assembly of North Gardina do enact: Section 1st, That it shall be unlawful for anyone to hunt on any land or lands in Craven county with o gun, dog or otherwise without the written consent of the owner of the lands or lands.

"Section 2nd, Every person violating this Act shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction shall be fined not less than \$5.00, nor more than Gillett of Jones county. They reported Durham 0 0 0 2 0 0 0 0 0 -2 \$25.00, or imprisonment not more than "Section 3rd. This Act shall be in
