The State Board of Education has referred to Secretary of State Grimes the question whether the county surveyors and all other surveyors in counties in which there are State lands should be under the direction of State Engineer J. H. McRee.

William Moncre of this city, who until two months ago was a prominent official of the Seaboard Air Line, is now building the Obarlotte, Monroe and Columbia railway, which is to shorten the distance between Charlotte and Columbia 69 miles.

The respite by the governor of J. A. Gorham and R. G. Ramsey, former law agents of the Southern railway, who were convicted at Statesville of tampering with a jury, is until March 17. This will be after the next term of court at Statesville and will allow the respondents to make a full statement of their case. They are making their fight to keep out of jail.

A young white man named Rollins is now in jail at New Bern. He was quite recently pardoned by the governor. The latter says the pardon was granted on the ground of ill health. Dr. Furguson, one of the penitentiary physicians, said Rollins had lung trouble. The trial judge and solicitor recommended the pardon.

THE LUMBER COMBINE.

Not Such an Easy Matter to Form the Trust.

NORFOLK, Jan. 23.—A large manufacturer of North Carolina pine lumber announced here today that persons representing large lumber manufacturing interests in Michigan have made a proposition to mill owners hereabouts to form a lumber trust and that it is being considered by the trade. He said that should Messrs. Chas. R. Flint, August Belmont and other New York capitalists attempt to carry out their expressed purpose to consolidate the North Carolina pine interests they will find that the price of mills is high and will meet with difficulties. He said the lumber market is in good shape and the time for the foundation of a combination is not so favorable as it was when Mr. Plant, former Governor Smith of Maryland and others chartered the Bay Liner Tennessee and came here under the pretense of hunting and looked over the field.

He said that practically all the standing timber on this coast is owned by the mills, and in the present state of the trade mill owners are very stiff.
