## REPUBLICANS NOMINATE

Judge Robinson the Unanimous Choice of the Convention at Goldsboro.

The Republican Executive Committee met at Goldsboro yesterday for the purpose of putting in nomination a candidate to represent the Republicans of the third District. Every county in the district was represented.

Mr C B Hill presided, and Mr Frank Brown of Jones was secretary. Judge W S O B Robinson of Wayne was placed in nomination by J F Dobson of Wayne. Maj H L Grant, of Wayne was placed in nomination by C M Babbitt of Pamlico.

On the first ballot the vote stood Robinson 6 and Grant 3. On motion of Mr Babbitt the nomination was made unanimous.

Judge Robinson came in to the meeting and made an enthusiastic speech accepting the nomination. He will at once issue a challenge to Congressman Thomas for a joint canvass in every county in the district.

## Good Politically, Certainly More Otherwise

President Bryan's report read at stock holders meeting, showed that the total gross earnings from operations of the A & N C road for the fiscal year which closed June 30th, 1904, to be \$31,322.89. Deduct from this the total operating expenses, fixed charges, interest, taxes etc, which amounts to \$252,508.19, and leaves a net income showing a profit of \$78,829.61, net for the past year's earnings or about 4.8 per cent profit on the capital stock. The statement shows a continual gradual increasing income.

The road was leased out on Sept 1st, to the Howland Improvement Company for \$5,000.00 per year or 3 per cent, which is \$25,000.00 per year less than it was earning under political management. This gives some idea of the value or the earning capacity of the property.
