Tobacco Market Prospects.

The following extract from an article in the Kinston Free Press announcing the opening of the tobacco market there in August, makes very encouraging reading for those farmers who have grown a good crop of the weed.

"The opinion of tobaccoists who are in close touch with the market is that prices will be better, though they don't look for a repetition of the fancy prices of 1902. Some reasons given for this belief are the light crop and curtailed acreage in the old belt, a larger number of independent buyers, more inquiry from the two large corporations, and the fact that the Japanese government has taken her account from the A. T. Company and will enter the market as an independent buyer. This last fact is especially significant, as the Japs are heavy purchasers of the American product."

One of the most elaborate banquets in the history of Wilmington was given to Gov. Glenn Monday night. The banquet was served at the Sea Shore house at Wrightsville. There were 175 guests at the feast and five dollars a plate was the price.

The Industrial News Will be Launched on the Journalistic Sea About September 1st.

It is a settled fact that the Republican party of the State will have an organ—perhaps two. The paper which appears to have a strong lead in the Industrial News. Ex-Senator Marion Butler is largely interested in the organization and he is said to be the leading spirit in the enterprise.

A meeting of directors and stockholders met in Greensboro Monday. Thomas S. Rollins, of Asheville was made President of the company, and R. D. Douglas, of Greensboro, Secretary. R. D. Douglas is to be Editor-in-Chief and J. P. Ackery, assistant foreman of the Washington Post to be foreman. The associate editor and other members of the staff are to be selected at an early date. The business manager has been selected but his name is withheld for a few days.

The paper will be a standard seven column, eight page paper, published six mornings in the week. Three linotypes have been engaged to do the work and every detail of the work will be conducted in a thoroughly up-to-date manner. Every department will have for its head conservative business men, who have had experience in newspaper work.

It is expected that the first issue of the Industrial News will appear September 1st.
