**Superior Court News.**

The slander case of Godett vs Bowen which was on trial Monday resulted in a verdict for the defendant. The jury reported during the night.

The attention of the court was taken up with the trial of Starkey vs the Southern Railway. The plaintiff stated in his complaint that the defendant violated contract in the capacity as common carrier. An agreement had been made between the parties of the suit by which the plaintiff and others were to be supplied with tickets upon the presentation of proper certificates. He further states that the ticket agent did not appear at his office soon enough for the certificates to be filed, it is a by-law of the defendant and members of his party delay in getting home from Raleigh, thereby causing a loss of money and time.

The railroad company is represented by its attorney F. H. Bunker; the attorneys for Starkey, are R. W. Williamson, W. D. Melver, D. L. Ward and B. B. Nixon. The case will be completed today.
