Entrusted Nurses.
The growing difficulty of procuring suitable help for housework and the care of children is a matter of frequent comment among those directly interested. When one does engage a servant the employer is kept in constant annoyance if not dread that some terrible accident may happen on account of the servants' recklessness. Particularly is this true of nurses, to whom is given the care of young infants and who, when with their friends, seem to totally disregard the welfare of those who have been entrusted to them.

A striking incident illustrating this very thing happened on our streets a few days ago. A nurse left her charge an infant of two months, in a go-cart on the sidewalk and went on a little further to join some social conversation with some friends and seemed to be oblivious of the fact that the child was anywhere around.

During the absence of the nurse the pillow which held the child had by some improper adjustment, slipped from the carriage to the ground, of course carrying the child along with it. Fortunately the little one was not seriously hurt. The mother of the child was kept in ignorance of the affair until informed by outside parties.

Of course the nurse made many excuses and explanation but her mistress very justly determined that she was not the one to have such a responsible place. The question now arises will that woman be employed in that capacity again and will her experience teach her better?

Householders may well dread for their children's safety when placed in the care of the average colored nurse.

Five members of the Naval Reserves left in the cutter *rowboat* last night for Morehead town by Bradley Hanff's motor boat. The rest of the New Bern division will go to Morehead today where they will join the Wilmington and Windsor divisions on board the steamer *Compton* which has been leased for a ten days cruise and on which they will take daily sea cruises.

The rainbow last night after the severe storm was one of the most gorgeous that has been seen here in many weeks. It is generally a sign of clearing up weather and the people all hope it will make good.

The friends of Hunter Smith are glad to see him out again after several weeks illness and confinement to the house.

A report reached here Tuesday that during the electric storm in the early part of the afternoon lightning struck the Coast Line depot at Jacksonville, N. C., and entirely consumed the building. The amount of loss nor any other particulars were not learned.

CROPS DAMAGED BY RAIN

Not Much Left of Tobacco and Cotton After Monday's Terrible Soaking.

The rain which has been the principal event for several weeks has worked a great deal of damage among the farmers. There has not been one crop that was up to the usual standard of yield and quality. All the early truck crops were hurt either by the cold-dry weather of May or the wet weather of June and the farmers could realize little or nothing from them. Potatoes were left to rot in the ground, the farmers having prevented from digging them on account of the rain, the cabbage, peas and beans all fell before the water-destroyer.

For a time there bade fair to be a success from the liquid element but it has started up again and has probably put the finishing touches on the cotton and tobacco crops. Farmers are dubious over the prospect for not one of their staples will yield more than a 25 per cent crop and then will be of inferior quality. The storm of Monday was one of the worst we have had this year. The amount of rainfall was 3.09 inches in 24 hours. There was only one worse storm, that of June 13, when 4.21 inches fell.

REVIEW GREAT FLEET.

Finest Ships to Assemble at Oyster Bay. Admiral Evans in Command.

Washington, July 23.—President Roosevelt will review on Labor Day September 3, at Oyster Bay, the largest fleet of American warships ever assembled. Acting Secretary of the Navy Newberry today received an order directing that the Atlantic fleet under the command of Rear-Admiral Robley D. Evans, with Rear-Admiral Willard H. Brown second in command, be assembled at Oyster Bay on September 3 and be reviewed by the President of the United States.

For the first time since they were placed in commission, the big, first-class battleships Rhode Island, Virginia, Georgia and New Jersey, representing the very latest type of warship construction by the United States Government, will participate in the naval review as a part of the big Atlantic fleet. Twelve battleships, including these four vessels, and the battleships Maine, Missouri, Kentucky, Kearsage, Alabama, Illinois, Indiana and Iowa will form the battleship squadron, which will be personally commanded by "Fighting Bob" Evans. The armored cruiser squadron, consisting of the modern armored cruisers West Virginia, Colorado, Maryland and Pennsylvania, and commanded by Rear Admiral Brownson, will maneuver as a unit of the Atlantic fleet. Immediately after the grand review, which will form the greatest naval spectacle ever known in the waters of the United States, the armored cruiser squadron will sail from Oyster Bay for the Philippine Islands, where it will form a part of the big Asiatic fleet. Upon the arrival of this squadron in the Orient the battleships Wisconsin and Ohio will be ordered back to the United States, the former to undergo extensive repairs on the Pacific coast and the latter to come around to the Atlantic coast to be the thirteenth battleship of the Atlantic fleet.

Many Americans attended the opening of the Wagner festival at Bairreuth.
