Dr. Matthews, the Dope Fiend
Must Serve Life Sentence
In Penitentiary.

Street Railway vs Railroad, Cumberland, reversed.
Fraduce Co. vs Dunn, Craven, no error.
Gunter vs Tobacco Co. Durham, per curiam, affirmed.
Turner vs Laws, Orange, per curiam affirmed.

In the noted case against Dr. Matthew of Greensboro convicted of murder in the second degree by poisoning his wife, with morphine, and who contended that he must, for poisoning be either convicted of murder in the first or discharged the court finds no error and declines to arrest judgment. The court holds that the statute which makes poisoning murder in the first degree says it only raises the presumption of murder in the first degree and the jury may return a verdict for a lesser offense or for an attempt to commit the crime. Matthews must serve his life term in the penitentiary.
