Raleigh, Nov. 17.—Col William J. Saunders died at his home here early this morning, aged 74 years. He was a son of the late Hon. Romulus M. Saunders, long a resident of this city, and who was minister of Spain, where Col. Saunders was born. Judge Saunders, the father, delivered the address at the unveiling of the Washington Monument at the capital square here. Col. Saunders in April, 1861 began his military service and was in Rossour's Light Battery, from this city, which was afterwards commanded by Basil C. Manly. Some months ago he was paralyzed. The Confederate veterans will attend the funeral in a body.

The North Harlowe school opened last Monday Miss Bessie Morton teaching.


Mr and Mrs Leon Hardison of Thurman came Saturday and spent Sunday, with Mr and Mrs Joshua Adams.

**Bradstreet's Weekly Trade Report.**  
Bradstreet's tomorrow will say for Richmond and vicinity:  
Business in all lines is active and the gain in volume of sales heretofore noted has been fully maintained. The weather has been unfavorable recently for the handling of tobacco, but prices are fair where a good price has been marketed. Fruit and produce are in good demand and the market absorbs all receipts at satisfactory prices.  
Foundries and machine shops are being operated at full capacity, and to meet the necessary demands additions to several plants are in course of erection or in contemplation.  
High winds and excessive rain-falls during October caused much damage to cotton and tobacco in parts of eastern North Carolina and Virginia. The loss varies, in some localities being as much as 60 per cent, while in other points not over 25 per cent. Only a comparatively limited area is so affected. The result is that collections in most lines are backward and requests for extensions are more numerous than they were a year ago.  
Most of the merchants and planters in the sections so affected are measurably prepared for the present adverse conditions, having made substantial profits during several preceding years. Extra time and indulgence may be required by some, but no serious financial stress is expected.  
Local retail trade improves steadily, but collections are a little slow.

**INTERESTING AND PROFITABLE MEETING.**

**Annual Convention of Tobacco Growers Association.**

(Special Correspondence)  
Greensboro Nov. 17.—The association of tobacco farmers known as the North Carolina Protective Association, held its annual meeting here today and tonight. There was a fairly good attendance of delegates from the tobacco growing counties, when President John S. Cunningham, called the session to order in the court house at twelve o'clock. Rev. H. W. Battle, of the First Baptist church, offered prayer, and Mayor Murphy delivered a fine welcome address. This was appropriately responded to by Secretary J. M. Sheep. Mr. C. C. Moore, president of the North Carolina Cotton Association, being called upon, made an excellent short talk on the necessity for farmers organizing for protection of prices of all products raised, whether of cotton, wheat, corn or tobacco. After announcing committees the session adjourned for dinner, after which Mr. J. O. Gravey, Grand Lecturer, made an able address.

At the afternoon session of the Association President Cunningham made an appropriate address outlining the acts accomplished by the Association in raising the price of tobacco, and was followed by Grand Lecturer, Gravey, who demonstrated that by organization, thereby reducing acreage and holding back tobacco, the Association had already been worth over a million dollars to tobacco planters.  
Resolutions were adopted recommending further decrease of acreage, discouraging forcing tobacco on glutted markets, and in fostering the establishment of storage warehouses, redrying houses, and factories. The legislature was memorialized to enact a law making it a misdemeanor for warehousemen to report having sold tobacco on their floors except original sales from first hands.

Officers elected were President, G. O. Key, Pilot Mountain; Secretary Treasurer, J. M. Sharpe, Rockingham county; State Lecturer, J. G. W. Gravey, Rocky Mount; Vice Presidents, J. Y. Stokes, Reidsville, J. C. Franks, Mt. Airy, G. G. Moore, Durham.
