WIRELESS TELEGRAPHY NO COMPETITIO

The System Not Perfected to The Extent to Make it Formidable Rival.

At a meeting of the stockho ders of the Western Telegraph Company, Lim ited, held in London on October 30, Sir, John Wolfe-Barry, K. C. B., one of the most prominent engineers in Great Britain, who presided over the meeting, said in his address:

"After the recent statements in the newspapers about the promised early opening for commercial business of a wireless system of telegraphy between Ireland and Canada, perhaps. expect me to offer a few words on the subject. One ought not, we are told, to prophesy until one knows, and l am by no means anxious to obtrude my opinions. On the other hand, however, I have been asked for my views as your chairman by several respected shareholders, and I feel it my duty not to refuse to say what I think on a subject which touches our interess. though I should have preferred to adopt the safer and more congenial policy of silence and the awaiting of the verdict of the logic events. But as I have been invited to express my opinion, I feel bound to say at once that, as far as I can judge, I do not look upon any system of wireless telegraphy as a serious competitor with our cables. Some years ago, I said the same thing and nothing has since occurred to alter my views, nor do I think that those of the experts whom we then consulted have become different. At that time the length over which wireless messages were sent, was perhaps, 300 or 400 miles, but I then said I did not put any bounds in that respect to the development of science, and that any imperfections of wireless telegraphy, however, remain, in the want of certainty of transmission, the want of secrecy, and in the confusion which must occu when messages are not covered by a direct conductor, such a sa telegraph cable of land-line, from point to point, but are thrown with great violence up into the other, into which they radiate in all directions, to be disentangled and interpreted at the other side of the globe. I am well aware that by tuning or syntonising the receiving instruments to the wave length of the sending instruments, some of these difficulties of publicity and confusion can be met, and to a limited extent this is the case, Se-

crecy, however, is only attainable so long as third narties abstain from tuning their instruments to interpret the messages-a process which I am told, on the highest authority, presents no difficulty. It is also evident that confusion of sumultaneous messages in the ether can be lessened by tuning, but there again we remember that is limited to an extent which seems to me to be quite incompatible with in the ether will be worse confounde

the requirements of a large telegraphic business. I believe that some 25,000 paying words pass to and from this country by cables during a busy hour, and we know that New York expects to receive and answer Stock exchange teltgrams with London in four or five minutes. After making all allowances for possible tuning. I cannot but think that the confusion if any considerable number of wire less messages are attempted. With regard to certainty of transmission, believe that many disturbances of the ether by natural cause must always be encountered, and that the longer the distance attempted the more for midable will be the difficulties from atmospheric or magnetic causes. Then again, I understand that a wireless sending station of high power cannot as is the case with telegraphy be continuous cables and wires, be at the same time a receiving station; or, in other words, messages cannot be sent and received simultaneously; and, it this be so, I foresee the greatest difficulties in dealing with one of the natters which cause constant trouble with any system of telegraphy-name ly, the elimination and correction of errors and the constantt demand for repetition of doubtful signals. For these and other reasons! do not look upon a wireless system as a serious impetitor with cables. I am as muc an admirer of the wonderful results obtained by wireless telegraphy a any one, and appreciate most highly the effortts of those who have shown the way in this very interesting derelopment of science, but I remain of my original opinion as to its practi-cal effort on cable enterprise—so far at least, as I can form a judgment under the abnormal conditions of secrecy which have from the first encreey which have from the first en-abrouded the operations of those who have the conduct of the wirelesss sys-tem. Wireless telegraphy will assur-edly be of great value to the world in certain localities and for certain purones, but I think that, funstead of he ng harmful to cable enterprise,


