Our Weekly Sermon

(By Rev. J. V. Williams)

"THE ANANIAS CLUB."

Text: Acts 5:2, "Why hath Satan filled thine heart to lie to the Holy Ghost?"

Ananias is one of the distinguished men in Biblical history. He made a name for being bad. There are many good men mentioned in the Bible whose names have dwindled in to oblivion, but every man in the Bible who was notoriously bad has made a name to live.

This Ananias was the first president of the "Ananias Club," and Sapphira, his wife, was his confidential secretary. There seemed to be perfect affinity between them. They were charmingly matched, and I have no doubt that they lived in great peace and harmony. I think it is a good thing for a bad man to have a bad wife. At least, it keeps up the idea of affinity, and the most awful thing this side of perdition is for a good man to be tied up with a bad woman. Hence, the Apostle, speaking of marriage, said, "Only in the Lord."

Ananias was a man who wanted to be popular. When he saw other people joining the church, of course, he "joined." His sort always go with the multitude, good or bad. He was getting along very well, and was quite popular until "a good man" sold his possessions and gave it to the Lord. At once this man became immensely popular. It was too much for Ananias, and he said to his wife, "we are losing deal, and something must be done." "We will sell our possessions and give it to the Lord," also, and become as popular as Barnabas, but we will not give it all to the Lord. We will save out something for ourselves, and we will get the credit for doing the same thing the other fellow did.

"We will keep back part of the price," "Good," said Sapphira, his wife, "you are a dear; you always know how to do the right thing." So they sold their possessions and brought the money to the church. The Holy Spirit revealed to St. Peter that this man was a hypocrite of the deepest dye.—Peter said, "Why hath Satan filled thy heart to lie to the Holy Ghost? Thou hast not lied to man, but unto God." Ananias fell dead.

In a short while his wife came in, not knowing what had happened, and she said to Peter when asked about the matter, "yes, indeed, we only got so much for the land." Peter said, "The fact of those who have buried their husband are at the door and will carry these out." And she too, died suddenly. This is a short statement of the history of the bad Ananias. So ended the first "Ananias Club."

Hypocrisy is the meanest thing in all the world and the most unreasonable thing. There is no reason why a man should play the hypocrite. It is far more popular to be bad than to be good, even in this advanced Christian age. When I see a man making a profession of religion and holding on to any of the old life, I always think that "he has kept back part of the price," and I always think that "he has kept back part of the price." He lies


Christ said, "ye cannot serve God and Mammon." And this is what mathematicians call an axiomatic truth, a self evident proposition, and every man and every woman in the community who professes the religion of Jesus Christ, and doesn't live it, is branded a liar by their neighbors. It matters not how bad the neighbors may be themselves.

The other day I heard a Christian man complaining that his horse did not thrive. He smelled very strongly of whiskey. I advised him to give the horse the whiskey, for if the horse did not thrive, it would not ruin his character, but the scent of the stuff on the man would ruin his character in this advanced Twentieth century. He said that he did not drink. I replied, "then you ought to have your friends stop pouring liquor on your clothes. He is a liar and a hypocrite."

I knew a man once who held a high position in church, he loved office, he loved display. He was often seen on the streets with a Bible under his arm and sometimes with other women, but never with his wife. He seemed to forget that the Bible says, "husbands, love your wives," and had read it, "husbands, love your neighbors wives." All sorts of "amors" attended that man. He was a ruined man but did not know it. He was playing the part of Ananias and there was not an individual in town who had confidence in him, including himself. The grandest man to be found today is the real true, godly character, and the most miserable scoundrel on the face of the earth is the modern Ananias, the prating hypocrite. Some "climber" will read this and say, "Give it to Him." "That is just the reason I don't attend church; there are too many hypocrites there."

Well, brother, there are only two classes of men and two places—the good and the bad—which do you belong to? Heaven or Hell, in which are you going? The hypocrite prays that there is a genuine character somewhere, and if you look, you can find


