Trinity College, Durham, N. C. Aug. 4, 1910—At a meeting of the Executive Committee of the Board of Trustees on Wednesday of this week three additions were made to the teaching force of the College for next year.

Arthur L. McCobb was elected Assistant Professor of French and German. Mr. McCobb was graduated from Bowdoin College with the degree of bachelor of art in 1905, is an A. M. of Harvard University, studied in Paris and Berlin, and has had two years experience in teaching.

Robert N. Wilson was elected Assistant Professor of Chemistry. Mr. Wilson was a native of North Carolina, was one year in Gullford, is an A. B. graduate of Haverford College, received the degree of Master of Science from the University of Florida, studied Chemistry at Harvard University, for several years professor of chemistry at Gulf College, Assistant Chemist, Florida Agricultural Experiment station. Mr. Wilson is a young scientist of much promise, is an experienced and uncommonly successful teacher, and will be a distinct addition to the working force of Trinity College.

Robinson G. Anderson was elected Professor of Law. Mr. Anderson is a graduate of Upper Iowa University, holds a graduate degree and also the degree of LL. B. from the University of Iowa, has had experience as a teacher, practiced law five years, has been a member of the editorial staff of the West Publishing Company, Paul, Minn., the foremost publishers of law books in this country. His services for this company have brought him into connection with the lawyers of this State, where he is well known. Mr. Anderson consents to come to the law school because of the high reputation it has won throughout the country, by its standard and by the learning of its Dean. The law faculty now consists of Dean S. F. Mordecai, Professors R. G. Anderson and R. P. Keane. Since its establishment in 1904 the law school has been very successful and its equipment and outlook are better now than ever before. For at least three reasons the law school deserves the attention of the entire State. It is the first law school in the Southern States to enforce a high standard of admission. The minimum requirement is two years of college work, or the equivalent. It is the first to use the case book system of teaching, which is nothing but the application of the inductive method to the teaching of law, and which has now been adopted in full or in modified form by leading law schools of America. It is likewise the first to prepare its own text book, and in this part of their work it is well known to experts throughout the State that Dean Mordecai and his associates have had brilliant success.
