## ALDERMEN REDUCE TAX RATE

Abolish Office Meat Inspector. Transfer Fare Rate. Increase of Tax Valuations.

The board aldermen met Tuesday night, in regular session. On motion reading minutes last meeting were dispensed with. Alderman McCarthy for finance committee reported bid of Hyman Supply Co. for boiler at \$1,325, and bid at \$4.44 per foot and recommended acceptance. Carried. Petition of residents asked that East Front St., above Union be paved. Referred. D. E. Henderson representing the meat dealers, asked relief from ordinance recently passed. This caused discussion, first ordinance was suspended until action of committee could amend same. Finally on motion Alderman Shriner, the office of meat inspector was abolished by a vote of 5 to 4.

Alderman Shriner made motion that city transfers be allowed to charge fares not to exceed 15 cents, instead of 10 cents. Carried. Alderman Gaskins reported on site for Sixth Ward Fire Co., and on motion Alderman Ellis committee was instructed to make lease of property on George near Queen St. for 10 years. Also ordered that Fourth Ward Engine house be repaired, and bids for 2,000 feet hose asked for, and two yds. Ordered that bids be asked for Wells used machine.

The city tax book for 1911 was turned over to the Tax Collector Tolson. The property valuations show over \$700,000 increase from last assessment. On motion Alderman Ellis, the tax vote was reduced from \$1.05 to \$1.00. An ordinance proposing segregation was read and continued for action. Tobo Roberts was elected keeper of colored cemetery. Some other matters were discussed and board took recess.

### Birth of Aeronautics.

It was on Aug. 1, 1783, that the Scotchman Black of Edinburgh filled a little bag with hydrogen gas and watched it rise to the ceiling of his room, and it was right then and there that the science of aeronautics was born. Cavendish had only a little while before proved that hydrogen gas was about eleven times lighter than common air, and it occurred to Black that, such being the case, a light bag inflated with it would ascend. The experiment in his room in Edinburgh showed that his surmise was correct. It was not long after Black made his demonstration that Montgolfier sent a sika balloon up into the heavens and watched it careening through space, and the following year, 1783, the Montgolfiers—Joseph and Stephen—made a successful ascent in a balloon. The same year Charles ascended in a hydrogen balloon to the height of 9,770 feet. Ballooning was a success, and in an amazingly short time it became popular in all lands.—New York American.

## NOTICE TO COTTON FARMERS

On account of the light weight bales coming to this market, the buyers held a meeting and decided for their own protection, that they would not accept a bale weighing 400 pounds or less, unless there is a deduction of ten pounds per bale; consequently in buying light weight bales in your territory, it will be absolutely necessary for you to deduct ten pounds per bale from bales weighing 400 pounds or under and 25 pounds per bale from bales weighing 300 lbs. or less. The usual custom was to deduct one dollar on bales under 300 lbs, which does not anything like cover the loss. Further we particularly want to call your attention with regard to tare, this must not exceed 22 pounds per bale, any cotton overrated you must either refuse to buy it or else buy it subject to tare claim when it arrives at Norfolk, and such notation must be made on the invoice for cotton. We cannot urge you too strongly to follow these instructions very carefully, otherwise we will have to bill you back for any loss sustained for either of the above causes.
