A THRILLING RIDE.

Flight of a Fast Mail Train to Maice Up Lost Time.

When the first really fast mail be-tween Omaha and San Francisco reach-ed Evanston, Wyo., at the foot of the Wasatch mountains, it was fifty minstes late. There it was met by a powerful engine in charge of a reckless engineer, Bill Downing by name. Cap-tain James E.
