SUGAR TRUST CASE BEGINS

Government Suit For Dissolution of American Sugar Refining Company Will Not be Set Tied Before 1914.

New York, May 14th—The long deferred Federal suit for the dissolution of the American Sugar Refining Company comes to a hearing today. District Attorney Wise and Assistant District Attorney Knapp, who represent the government in the proceedings to break up the so-called sugar trust as a conspiracy in restraint of trade in defiance of the Sherman antitrust law are allowed sixty days for the introduction of the government's testimony.

The court of appals, in order to expedite matters, has allowed 165 days to the defense for answering testimony and 30 days each for rebuttal.

Should all this time be consumed, the printed record of testimony could not be submitted to court until early next year and no decision could possibly be expected until the spring of 1913. Should the government win, an appeal to the United States Supreme Court will probably defer a final settlement until 1914.

The government will ask the court to find that the defendants have been engaged in a conspiracy to monopolize trade and commerce in raw sugar, sugar beets, refined sugar, molasses, syrups and other products of raw sugar and sugar beets. Moreover, they will try to prove that the American Sugar Refining Company, the National Sugar Refining Company, of New Jersey and the Western Sugar Refining Company are, each of them, a trust in themselves and have endeavored to monopolize trade and commerce.
