### THROWS LIGHT ON CROOKEDNESS

#### Drainage Engineer Tells of Deals in North Carolina.

Washington, June 6.—J. O. Wright, now a drainage engineer for the State of Florida, before the House committee investigating the so-called Florida everglades charges yesterday, told of his private land deals in North Carolina with a drainage engineer in the Department of Agriculture. Wright admitted that he accepted stock and negotiated with certain North Carolina land companies and the State of North Carolina without telling his superiors. He said he got \$5,000 stock in the Albemarle Development Company from J. N. Wilkinson of Belhaven, N. C., and in return drew up a plan reclaiming the land and placed \$14,000 in stock.

Wilkinson came to him in Washington, Wright said, accompanied by Representative John Small of North Carolina. After their conference, he was offered \$5,000 and Representative Small got \$1,000 in stock for his legal services. Wright told of a "deal" with John Seip of Chilloe, O., at Moyock, N. C., in which he was promised \$7,600 for his advice. He did not tell his chief of the offer and never got the money.

The State of North Carolina offered him \$5,000 to sell Lake Mattamuskeet in the dike swamp, he said. In this he got \$1,250, of which his superiors knew nothing. He also engaged himself in the Lake Mattamuskeet scheme on a contingent interest of \$40,000.

At Wilson, N. C., with Lawrence Brett, another employee of the Department, Wright went into a drainage deal, which he testified cost him \$2,200 and Brett \$9,000.

### Begin Probe on the Money Trust.

Washington, June 6.—The money trust investigation will begin in New York this morning. A process server left for New York yesterday armed with several subpoenas. Mr. Pojo declined to make public the names of those who will be called. The first subject of investigation will be the relations of banks with the New York Clearing House and with banks in other sections of the country. The committee will also seek to discover the mutuality of interest of the banks, clearing house and New York Stock Exchange.

The first witness, it was learned just before the committee left for New York, probably will be A. R. Hepburn, president of the New York Clearing House. The hearing is to be held in the customs house and the investigation into the relation of the clearing house with the banks and Wall Street is to be probed deeply.

### AFTER LIGHTS ON CONVENTION

#### Raleigh's Splendid Hospitality. A Peerless Chairman. Two Personages. Hon. Locke Craig.

Raleigh, June 7.—The State Democratic Convention had a number of notable features. It was a very large gathering, taxing the Capitol city's accommodations, but the Raleighites nobly responded and made room for every visitor. The courtesies extended on all sides made the visit most pleasant to the 1,000 or so delegates.

The convention in naming F. D. Winston its presiding officer could not have made a better choice. Mr. Winston in addition to being an able parliamentarian, has a voice for reaching and captivating. He is gifted in "sensing" in advance the spirit of the crowd, and while apparently letting the convention "run wild," really has it under his personal control. He is without a peer as a chairman.

Two striking personages in the convention were Uncle Lou Midgett, of Oriental, and Frank Turner, of Raleigh. The former was conspicuously the first among the Underwood sympathizers. In every part of the hall could his towering form and long out-stretched arms be seen. He enjoyed every minute whether the band was playing, or he was shouting "Underwood!" Frank Turner was the human automaton, standing on a chair with hat in hand, his arms would rise and fall, extended towards the chairman, 15 minutes without cessation, during times of heated debate. He never got recognition, but came back, as the commanding attention of the convention.

The attitude of the Governor from Buncombe, in accepting the gubernatorial nomination so spontaneously tendered him, was peculiarly characteristic of the splendid gentleman and democrat. His innate modesty made him cut short the oration given him as he appeared.
