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GOVERNMENT INVESTIGATES

Prosecution of Liquor Shipper May Result From Inquiry.

The forty-three barrels of whiskey which was libeled and taken from the Norfolk Southern Railway Company's freight depot in this city a few weeks ago still remains stored in the government building and will doubtless remain there until the April term of Federal court. This whiskey was shipped to one J. H. Smith by a firm in Cincinnati, O., and the government is now making an investigation to find out whether or not the shippers knew that they were shipping this whiskey to one person and that another was receiving it. There is a heavy penalty for knowingly shipping whiskey to a man and using an assumed name and if such is found to be the facts in this case the shipper will be prosecuted.

EXPECT REVOLT IN PHILIPPINES

Said to Be a "Frame-Up" For Revolution In The Islands This Winter.

MERELY A POLITICAL MOVE

Planned For Purpose of Showing That Islands Are Not Ready for Independence.

Washington, Jan. 8.—According to information received by the Bureau of Insular Affairs and transmitted to the War Department, there is a "frame-up" for a revolution in the Philippine Islands this winter. This plan, according to the information, has been made by the wealthy property owners in the Island of Luzon, on which Manila is located. The revolution is planned for the purpose of showing that the Philippines are not yet ready for independence.

The Bureau of Insular Affairs has received reports giving some details of the coming insurrection, headed by the wealthy property owners of the provinces contiguous to Manila, the capital.

The same report states that the movement originally was planned merely as a political move, to offset the activities of Manuel L. Quezon Resident Commissioner at Washington from the Philippines. Senator Quezon has been fighting in and out of Congress for Philippine independence. According to the reports received the insurrection has got away from the leaders to such an extent that it is feared that there will be much bloodshed and murder before it can be suppressed.

Secret service agents of the civil government in the Philippines and intelligence officers of the army stationed in the islands have been making investigations. They have reported that the tinder for an uprising against law and order has been furnished and is liable to be ignited at any time. Preparations to meet the emergency are being made. The centre of trouble appears to be in the Province of Benguet. Talyab, Rizal and Laguna, Manila is in Rizal Province.

ALCAZAR ASHORE.

Fate still pursues the Spanish schooner Alcazar which was abandoned off the coast of North Carolina on Christmas Day and which was later picked up by a passing steamer and carried to Lookout Cove. Wednesday night the schooner broke her anchor cable and drifted ashore. A wireless message was sent to the revenue cutter Seminole at Wilmington and Thursday afternoon that vessel left for Lookout Cove to render whatever assistance was possible.

TO CELEBRATE LEE'S BIRTHDAY
