JURY COMPOSED ENTIRELY OF WOMEN

ANDERSON, S. C., Jan. 7.—What is declared to be the first instance in South Carolina where a jury composed solely of women sat in a court of justice took place yesterday when Magistrate H. A. Foster, of Brushy Creek township, empaneled four matrons and two single women to pass upon the guilt or innocence of a negro charged with the larceny of two kitchen chairs. After deliberating 15 minutes the jury returned a verdict of guilty and the negro was sentenced to pay a fine of \$10.

WOMAN BEGINS FORTIETH DAY OF FASTING

DANVILLE, Ill., Jan. 7.—On the eve of her fortieth day of fasting in an attempt to induce her husband to join her church, Mrs. Ernest S. Harrington last night for the first time appeared to have a slight fever. She continued to claim that she had taken no food since her fast began and declared she intends continuing the fast until her husband's heart is softened.
Mr. Harrington has written to the supervisor of the Church of God, who resides at Eldorado, Ill., asking him to visit Danville and use his influence in the hope of causing a cessation of the fast. Dr. Geroy, who examined Mrs. Harrington Wednesday, said while her increasing emaciation may be the only outward sign of physical weakening, her heart may give way at any time.
