PREDICTS 1921 WILL BE YEAR OF FAMINE.

Indian Trail Cor. Monroe Journal. In a letter to the writer, Mr. J. McDonald of New York makes some awful predictions. He says the year 1921 will be known as a year of famine, not to be caused by any natural phenomena but by the exodus from the farm to the city.

Mr. McDonald urges the people of Union county to stick to the soil, plant all the foodstuffs we can, and great will be our reward. Continuing, his letter reads: "This is going to be a year for thieves, robbers, evil minded and scandalous people, bowers of them. There will be lots of influenza in the early spring, and afflictions of the memory, brain, imperfections of speech and colds in the head, throat and lungs will prevail."

"Fruit in some sections will be abundant, in other sections it will be a fail ure. There will be plenty of snow and ice all through the month of February. Hops and grapes will be poor; mice will be numerous; worms and fish scarce."

"Our new president will be popular; many fires will occur in two theaters and schools; large floods in the eastern and central states; heavy storms and tornadoes in the central states; many deaths from drugs and by suicide. In general everything we need will be greatly reduced in price; and trade and commerce will be good."

HOG KILLING.

Stanley News Herald. The following article contributed to The Wadesboro M. and J. by Mrs. Rosa Lind A. Redfern, on "hog killing time on the farm," is enough to make a fellow who was brought up on the farm and moved to town homesick. The description is so vivid that one can fairly smell the good things described, hear the conversation and experience the hilarity of the occasion over again. The article is as follows:

"Hog killing time on the farm! What does it mean? Father and the boys up before the first streak of dawn, when the big pots are filled with water, and a roaring fire built around each one. Mother and the girls hurrying up breakfast, everybody running here and there getting things ready, such as sharpening of knives and joking with the neighbors who also raised the biggest hog in the settlement. All the little boys of the neighborhood watching eagerly, getting blacker and blacker with the smoke and grease as the day goes by, all the dogs and chickens standing by to catch a bit of meat as it falls, the odor of red pepper and sage being dried out for sausage, fresh liver, potatoes and coffee being cooked for dinner. Can't you see the picture? And don't it make you hungry?"

"The delicious spare ribs, back bone and sausage makes us forget the cold, disagreeable part, and a box of these good things sent to friends in town, most makes them wish they lived on the farm, too."

"Many a little pig, the pet of a girl or boy, has been raised up and put on the market, transforming itself into a piece of furniture, some silver for the table, or a suit of clothes for its owner. The boy or girl who has never had the joy of raising a pig of their very own has missed a lot, and why is it that father always wants to give them the runt? Butter milk, scraps, corn, meal, wheat bran and a lot of loving attention have often changed these little runts into the pride of the barnyard, and they have also started many a bank account."

"When a city boy wishes to earn pocket money he sells papers, becomes a delivery boy or runs errands. What can a country boy do if he wishes to have a bank account of his own? He has ways that are simpler and easier and far more interesting than any of the manner. The city boy has, just think of the pleasure and the profit that can be derived from a flock of poultry, from turkeys, from a cow, from a garden, from raising a pig."

"Try some of these things this year and see if it doesn't beat a cotton patch."
