CENTERING OFF HATTERAS (By The Associated Press.)

WASHINGTON, Feb. 7. - Warning of a storm of "marked intensicentral near Cape Hatteras, was issued early today by the weather Bureau. The storm, the Bureau advised, will move rapidly northeastward and north, shifting to northeast winds and gales. Storm warnings have been extended north of the Virginia Capes to Boston, Mass.

Storm warnings are displayed on the Atlaptic coast from Jacksonville, Fla.,

The coast storm, the Weather Bureau said, will move rapidly northeastward and will be followed by generally fair weather tonight and Wednesday in the States east of the Mississippi river.

The Cape Hatteras disturbance came from Louisiana, the bureau said, and was attended by precipitation almost general ly east of the Mississippi river.
