AN ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE THE ISSUANCE OF \$10,000.00 OF BONDS OF THE TOWN OF BESSEMER CITY, NORTH CAROLINA, FOR THE PURPOSE OF ERECTING A MUNICIPAL BUILDING.

Be it ordained by the Board of Town Commissioners of the Town of Bessemer City in Gaston County, North Carolina, as follows: Section 1. Pursuant to "The Municipal Finance Act, 1921" of North Carolina, bonds of the Town of Bessemer City are hereby authorized to be issued in the aggregate principal amount of not exceeding \$10,000, for the purpose of the erection and equipment of a municipal building for said Town of Bessemer City, and of the expense of the Town at large.

Section 2. That a tax sufficient to pay the principal and interest of said bonds shall be annually levied and collected. Section 3. That the following matters are hereby determined and declared, pursuant to the requirements of Section 2942 and Section 2943 of said "The Municipal Finance Act, 1921": (a). The probable period of usefulness of the improvement for which said bonds are to be issued, is thirty years computed from October 1, 1922.

Section 4. This ordinance shall be published once in each of two successive weeks after its final passage, in The Gastonia Gazette which is a newspaper published in Gaston County and has a circulation in the Town of Bessemer City, greater than that of any other newspaper published in said County, and there being no newspaper published in the Town of Bessemer City. This ordinance shall also be posted at the door of the building in which the Board of Town Commissioners usually holds its meetings and at three other public places in the Town of Bessemer City. The Clerk to the Board of Town Commissioners shall cause this ordinance to be published and posted as aforesaid.

Section 5. This ordinance shall take effect thirty days after its first publication, unless, in the meantime, a petition for its submission to the voters is filed under the Municipal Finance Act, 1921, and in such event it shall take effect when approved by the voters at an election as provided in said Act.

The foregoing ordinance was passed on the 27th day of February, 1922, and was first published on the 15th day of May, 1922. Any action or proceeding questioning the validity of said ordinance must be commenced within thirty days after its first publication.

AN ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE THE ISSUANCE OF \$8,000.00 OF BONDS OF THE TOWN OF BESSEMER CITY, NORTH CAROLINA, FOR THE PURPOSE OF EXTENDING THE WATER SYSTEM OF SAID TOWN.

Be it ordained by the Board of Town Commissioners of the Town of Bessemer City in Gaston County, North Carolina, as follows: Section 1. Pursuant to "The Municipal Finance Act, 1921" of North Carolina, bonds of the Town of Bessemer City are hereby authorized to be issued in the aggregate principal amount of not exceeding \$8,000, for the purpose of extending the water supply system of said Town.

Section 2. That a tax sufficient to pay the principal and interest of said bonds shall be annually levied and collected. Section 3. That the following matters are hereby determined and declared, pursuant to the requirements of Section 2942 and Section 2943 of said "The Municipal Finance Act, 1921": (a). The probable period of usefulness of the improvement for which said bonds are to be issued, is forty years, computed from October 1, 1922.

Section 4. This ordinance shall be published once in each of two successive weeks after its final passage, in The Gastonia Gazette which is a newspaper published in Gaston County and has a circulation in the Town of Bessemer City, greater than that of any other newspaper published in said County, and there being no newspaper published in the Town of Bessemer City. This ordinance shall also be posted at the door of the building in which the Board of Town Commissioners usually holds its meetings and at three other public places in the Town of Bessemer City. The Clerk to the Board of Town Commissioners shall cause this ordinance to be published and posted as aforesaid.

Section 5. This ordinance shall take effect thirty days after its first publication, unless, in the meantime, a petition for its submission to the voters is filed

under the Municipal Finance Act, 1921, and in such event it shall take effect when approved by the voters at an election as provided in said Act.

AN ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE THE ISSUANCE OF \$85,000.00 OF BONDS OF THE TOWN OF BESSEMER CITY, NORTH CAROLINA, FOR THE PURPOSE OF IMPROVING THE STREETS OF SAID TOWN.

Be it ordained by the Board of Town Commissioners of the Town of Bessemer City in Gaston County, North Carolina, as follows: Section 1. Pursuant to "The Municipal Finance Act, 1921" of North Carolina, bonds of the Town of Bessemer City are hereby authorized to be issued in the aggregate principal amount of not exceeding \$85,000 for the purpose of improving and paving streets in said Town, of which, one-half of the cost, exclusive of the cost of paving at street intersections, is to be specially assessed against abutting property.

Section 2. That a tax sufficient to pay the principal and interest of said bonds shall be annually levied and collected. Section 3. That the following matters are hereby determined and declared, pursuant to the requirements of Section 2942 and Section 2943 of said "The Municipal Finance Act, 1921": (a). The probable period of usefulness of the improvement for which said bonds are to be issued, is twenty years, computed from October 1, 1922.

Section 4. This ordinance shall be published once in each of two successive weeks after its final passage, in The Gastonia Gazette which is a newspaper published in Gaston County and has a circulation in the Town of Bessemer City, greater than that of any other newspaper published in said County, and there being no newspaper published in the Town of Bessemer City. This ordinance shall also be posted at the door of the building in which the Board of Town Commissioners usually holds its meetings and at three other public places in the Town of Bessemer City. The Clerk to the Board of Town Commissioners shall cause this ordinance to be published and posted as aforesaid.

Section 5. This ordinance shall take effect thirty days after its first publication, unless, in the meantime, a petition for its submission to the voters is filed

and there being no newspaper published in the Town of Bessemer City. This ordinance shall also be posted at the door of the building in which the Board of Town Commissioners usually holds its meetings and at three other public places in the Town of Bessemer City.
