ABANDONED MINISTRY AFTER RETURNING FROM WAR

CHARLESTON, W. VA., May 20. -Fifty-four candidates for the ministry abandoned this vocation after returning from the World War, necording to the report of the Executive Committee of Christian Education and Ministerial Relief to the Southern Presbyterian General Assembly here. The committee added, however, that it has been in communication during the last year with 505 young men who have decided to enter the minis-

The report stated that whereas for forty-four years the proportion of candidates for the ministry to the membership Winston-Salem at Greensboro (two of the church was one candidate to each 609 members, the ratio last year was one to 1.117 members.






