French atmosphere will pervade New Orleans during the five days, beginning October 16, when the 1922 convention of the American legion is held in that city, a communication from the committee there declares.

The famous carnival atmosphere of the Mardi Gras will prevail. Athletic con-tests will be put on. War vessels of many nations will stage maneuvers. A spectacular air raid will take place abova the business center of the city. Women visitors will be entertained with French fetes, yacht reviews, tens, luncheons and automobile tours.

Arriving in New Orleans the visitor will meet Creole and French girls attired in headdress and garb of Brittany, Normandy and other picturesque French provinces. On sale at the street corner will be a special La Vie Parisienne edition of a local newspaper. A great white way, with 13,000 electric lights, will make a memorable display on the down-town stifts. Amusements will be so arranged that each man will be able to take advantage of the kind of entertainment he desires.

All the large hotels are co-operating with the convention committee and have agreed to provide a bed for \$1.50 and \$2.50 a day. Private homes will be open to those who prefer to be away from the

As a special act of courtesy to the legion hosts, a celebrated French carnival parade will be held by a number of French societies that have made the Mardi Gras a national event. The water carnival is expected to be one of the most unique features of the convention. All the great naval powers have been invited to send ships to participate. British, French, Italian, Mexican, Brazilian and Cuban craft will participate.






