The Charlotte Y. M. C. A. has assumed a large part of the salary and expenses of Mr. Charles Luther Boynton, a graduate of Pomona College, California, and also of Union Theological Seminary, New York, who is now on the Pacific en route to Shanghai, China, where he goes to act as office secretary for the National Committee of the Young Men's Christian Association of China. The contributions for missions made by the students this year through the association will be applied to Mr. Boynton's work, and the Missionary Department hopes to raise at least one hundred dollars for this purpose.

His work in the office will include the administration of the national budget, the care of the records of the national and local movements, the publication of literature for use in connection with the Association movement Chinese among speaking peoples, and a amount of other detailed work necessarily entailed.

It will be possible for Mr. Boynton to enter more immediately upon this service than almost any other new man has been able to do, for the office of the General Committee is already equipped and partially manned. His program for the first three years will include the study of Chinese in the mornings and the care of the office during the afternoons, with the privilege of working in the local Associations of Shanghai.
