A. will present in Gerrard Hall tomorrow evening the Marietta La Dell Concert Company, a "triple star attraction" consisting of Marietta La Dell, impersonator and reader, George Fox, solo violinist, and Miss Mabel Palen, soprano. The last company that appeared under the auspices of the Y. M. C. A. did not receive the patronage that it merited. It is to be hoped that this attraction will receive a larger attendance.

**Gymnasium Test.**

Twelve of the members of the gymnasium team which has been in training since November entered the trial contest for gym N. C.'s Monday afternoon. Of the contestants only three succeeded in doing all the stunts prescribed by Dr. Lawson: Messrs. B. C. Johnson, C. D. Wardlaw, and S. G. Noble. Mr. Johnson made the highest average of the three and was declared the best all round gym athlete in college by the judges, Dr. C. S. Mangum and Mr. N. C. Curtis. There will be another similar test in May, in which several of the men who failed in this trial will probably qualify.

**Phi Beta Kappa.**

The Phi Beta Kappa Society met Tuesday afternoon to consider the advisability of securing a speaker to make an address before it during Commencement. It was decided to

have the address on Saturday, June 1st. Senior Class Day, and a committee consisting of Dr. Eben Alexander, Dr. Archibald Henderson, and Dr. C. Alphonso Smith, was appointed to secure the orator for the occasion. A committee was also appointed to look over the grades of the members of the Sophomore and Junior classes in order that all prospective candidates for the society may be encouraged to put forth a little extra effort this spring.

**Di and Phi.**

The societies were of one mind Saturday night, so far as their queries went, at least. In both halls the question for discussion was, Resolved, That the federal government should levy a progressive income tax, the query for the Commencement Debate. Constitutional objections were barred in the treatment of the question. In both societies the negative won, Mr. W. H. Duls making the best speech in the Di, and Mr. L. N. Taylor carrying off the honors in the Phi.

After the regular debate in the Di Society Messrs. T. L. Simmons and P. M. Williams, the society's representatives in the Commencement Debate, spoke briefly on the affirmative side of the question.
