## The New Constitution

 (Continued from page 1.)vote by roll call; and if ten member vote in favor of said motion, the roll shall be called.
Sec. 2. Elections. The election for the Manager and Sub-Managers of the Football Team shall be held on the first Saturday in December. The election for President, Vice President, Secretary, and Treasur er of the Association, Manager and Sub-Managers of the Baseball Team, Manager of the Track Team, and all other officers of the Association shall be held on the first Saturday in May. But these officers, with the exception of the Managers and Sub-Managers of the different teams shall not take their seats until the following year.
Sec. 6. The President of the Association shall advertise the election of officers at least forty-eight hours before hand, and in the manner prescribed for advertising other meetings.
Sec. 7. The management of the Association's business shall be intrusted to the following officers and committees: A President, VicePresident, Secretary, Treasurer, Mauager and at least two SubManagers of the Football Team, Manager and at least two Sub-Managers of the Baseball Team. Manager of the Track Team; Commit tee on Finance, Committee on Rec ommendations, Committee on Rules and Relations, Committee for the A warding of Sweaters, and such special committees as may be appointed, by the President of the Association, for the transaction of particular business.
Article V-Duties oe Officers and Committees.
Sec. 1. President. (a) No person shall be eligible for Presidení of the Association until he shall have lived at this University for a period of three years. (b) The President shall call and preside over all meetings of the Association; shall decide all questions of order; shall vote in case of a tie, but not otherwise; and shall appoint all committees whose appointment is not otherwise provided for.
Sec. 2. Vice President. (a) No member shall be eligible for the office of Vice-President who is not eligible for the office of President. (b) The Vice-President shall perform all the duties of the President in the absence or incapacity of the President.
Sec. 3. Secretary. (a) The Secretary shall be chosen from the Senior Class. (b) It shall be his duty to keep a record of all the proceedings of the Assuciation. He shall keep also a roll of members and shall have it together with the minute book at all meetings duly called. He shall also obtain from the Treasurer, and keep as a record, the names of all mambers who have been disfranchised for the non-payment of dues.
Sec. 4. Treasurer. (a) The Treasurer shall be chosen from the Senior Class. (b) He shall have charge of the general treasury of the Athletic Association. He shall cover all moneys into the treasury; and, on the written order of the chairman of the Finance Committee, acting for the Committee, shall dishurse
to collect all fees due to the Associ- Committee, the members of the ation, and to keep a record of the Committee on Rules and Relations, same. He shall have anthority to the Presiden:, Vice-President, the expend such sums as may be necessary for the purchase of stationery for the Association. (d) He shall receive fifty dollars for his services. (e) The Treasurer, before entering upon his duties, shall give a bond, the amount of which shall be fixed by the Finance Committee, and the bond must also be approved by this Committee. The Association shall pay all fees necessary for the pro curement of the Treasurer's bond.
Sec. 5. Managers of Teams (a) No person shall be eligible to the office of Manager of the Foot ball Team or Baseball Team who has not served at least one term as Sub-Manager. (b) It shall be the duty of each Manager to prepare a schedule of games for his team; to make suitable provisions for the comfort of his team while on its trips; to arrange for the accommo dation of visiting teams; to provide for the clothing of his team; and to hold in trust all moneys which may come into his hands; and he shall have authority to expend such sums as may be necessary to meet the obligations incurred by his team (c) At the end of the season each Manager sliall turn over all money in his hands to the Treasurer of the Association, and shall make an itemized statement of all his transactions to the Finance Committee. (d) At least two Sub-Managers, and if necessary more, shall be elected by the Association to assist the Managers of the Football and Baseball Teams. (e) The Sub-Managers shall be chosen from the Junior and Sophomore classes.
Sec. 6. Finance Commitlee. (a) This Committee shall be compesed of five members, two, and onIy two, of which shall be members of the Faculty. The members of this Committee shall be appointed by the President of the Association acting by and with the advice of the Vice-President and Secretary of the Association. It shall be the duty of this Committee to hear all claims against the Associaton; and to make all orders on the Treasurer for the payment of moneys. (c) It shall be the duty of the Finance Committee to employ coaches for the various teams. (d) This Committee shall inspect the books of the Treasurer and the various Managers at the end of each season, and shall make a report to the Association at the last meeting of each term. It shall have authority also to inspect the books of any officer of the Association at any time.
Sec. 7. Commitlee on Rules and Relations. (a) This Committee shall be composed of five members, three of whom shall be members of the Faculty, appointed by the President of the University; and two of whom shall be student members of the Association elected by the Association. (b) It shall be the duty of thisCommittee to make rules togovern athletics, todetermine the eligibility of men desiring to play on the teams, and to represent the Association in disputes with other colleges as to rules and eligibility of players.
Sec. 8. Commillee on Recommendations. (a) This Committee shall be composed of the Finance Sec. 9. Cor or the Association Sweaters. (a) A Committee fo a warding sweaters shall be appoint ed for each of the teams. Each Committee shall consist of the Captain, Manager, and Coach o the particular team, and two addi tional members to be appointed by the President ot the Association one of whom shall be a student and the other a member of the faculty (b) Each of these committees shall, at the end of the athletic season, select such men as have by their athletic attainments shown themselves worthy of sweaters; and shall report at the last meeting o the Association the number sweaters and to whom given on the different teams.

Article VI-Amendments.
Sec. 1 This Constitution shal be amended only by a two-thirds vote of all the members eligible to vote at a meeting regularly called for the purpose of amending. But each amendment must be submitted in writing, read before the Association, and allowed to lie on the table one week before it shall become a part of this constitution.
