vote by roll call; and if ten member vote in favor of said motion, the roll shall be called.

Sec. 2. Elections. The election for the Manager and Sub-Managers of the Football Team shall be held on the first Saturday in December. The election for President, Vice-President, Secretary, and Treasurer of the Association, Manager and Sub-Managers of the Baseball Team, Manager of the Track Team, and all other officers of the Association shall be held on the first Saturday in May. But these officers, with the exception of the Managers and Sub-Managers of the different teams shall not take their seats until the following year.

Association shall advertise the election of officers at least forty-eight hours before hand, and in the manner prescribed for advertising other meetings.

Sec. 7. The management of the Association's business shall be intrusted to the following officers and come into his hands; and he shall committees: A President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, Mauager and at least two Sub-Managers of the Football Team, Manager and at least two Sub-Managers of the Baseball Team, Manager of the Track Team; Committee on Finance, Committee on Recommendations, Committee on Rules and Relations, Committee for the Awarding of Sweaters, and such special committees as may be appointed, by the President of the Association, for the transaction of particular business.

ARTICLE V-DUTIES OF OFFICERS AND COMMITTEES.

Sec. 1. President. (a) No person shall be eligible for President of the Association until he shall have lived at this University for a

(b) It shall be the Sec. 6. The President of the duty of each Manager to prepare a schedule of games for his team; to make suitable provisions for the comfort of his team while on its trips; to arrange for the accommodation of visiting teams; to provide for the clothing of his team; and to hold in trust all moneys which may have authority to expend such sums as may be necessary to meet the obligations incurred by his team (c) At the end of the season each Manager shall turn over all money in his hands to the Treasurer of the Association, and shall make an itemized statement of all his transactions to the Finance Committee. (d) At least two Sub-Managers, and if necessary more, shall be elected by the Association to assist the Managers of the Football and Baseball Teams. (e) The Sub-Managers shall be chosen from the Junior and Sophomore classes.

Sec. 6. Finance Committee. (a) This Committee shall be composed of five members, two, and only two, of which shall be members of the Faculty. The members of this Committee shall be

It shall advise the Association, but shall not be allowed to act for the Association. Sec. 9. Committees for Awarding Sweaters. (a) A Committee for awarding sweaters shall be appointed for each of the teams. Each Committee shall consist of the Captain, Manager, and Coach of the particular team, and two additional members to be appointed by the President of the Association; one of whom shall be a student and the other a member of the faculty. (b) Each of these committees shall, at the end of the athletic season, select such men as have by their athletic attainments shown themselves worthy of sweaters; and shall report at the last meeting of the Association the number of sweaters and to whom given on the different teams.

ARTICLE VI-AMENDMENTS.
