committee and to be collected by the representatives of each association and forwarded to the secretary. That the money so received shall be spent in developing a system of alumni assistant coaches, and in the maintaining the association.

5 That it lend such advice to the active athletic association at the University as it deems advisable.

That we urge the active athletic association to adopt either a Yale or Princeton, no other, system of coaching and stick to it from year to year and learn the most recent style of Yale and Princeton play each year.

7. That we urge the active athletic association to get the best man that can be gotten to teach whichever style of play is chosen, regardless of money.

8. That the alumni association establish a system of assistant alumni coaches, one for each position of the team to assist the head coach and that these men be paid for their time.

9. That the alumni athletic association help pay the expenses of alumni coaches.

10. That the association secure a copy of all eligible men now in force and an exposition of the faculty system of athletic supervision now in force at the University.

11. That we condemn the five month's rule as unjust in every respect to the men and to the University, in view of conditions, not rules, prevailing at other colleges.

12. That we condemn the rule debaring men who have never received more than expenses for having participated in athletic contests.

13. That we lament the low ebb to which the University of North Carolina athletics have fallen in the past two years and pledge ourselves to an effort to better present conditions.

14. That we endorse every thought expressed in the letter of "An Alumnus", that appeared in the December 1 edition of the Charlotte Observer.

15. That a copy of these of these be sent with a request for immediate publication to the Charlotte Observer, The News and Observer, Industrial News, The Wilmington Messenger and Tar Heel.
