With Other Colleges

The rules formulated for the new honor system at the University of Alabama are to go into effect April 1. The old system is said to have ceased to exist. Under the new rules a committee, known as the Honor Committee, will be at the head of the system. This committee is composed of three seniors, elected by the senior class, one representative elected by each of the other three classes, and a seventh man, who, in each trial shall be the president of the class to which the accused belongs. The only breaches of honor mentioned are: cheating on examinations, and handing in some copied exercise as one's original work. The rules provide that there shall be no appeal from the decision of the Honor Committee. The rules are to be read and explained on "College Night" at the beginning of each year and printed in the first issue of the college paper. This paper, The Crimson-White, in commenting on the new system says:

"It is impossible to cultivate a spirit of honor by legislation. Honor is in the spirit and not in the letter. If the spirit of honor is not back of these voluminous regulations, they are worthless; and if the right spirit is back of them, they are unnecessary."

What news from Wake Forest next? Following her defeats by Bingham, and Trinity Park School, she lost to Atlantic Christian College by a score of 9 to 0.

It is stated in an enthusiastic article on the *Observer's* spring page that 4,000 people will probably be admitted to the Carolina-Virginia game in Charlotte.
