**Lafayette Defeats Carolina**

Defeat came to Carolina for the first time this season when in Winston-Salem Monday Lafayette won a 6 to 1 victory.

Demott started things with a rush, fanning the first four men to face him, but the fifth, Duncan landed on a swift one, and before the right fielder could out run it, had crossed the pan with Carolina's only run. The only other hit was secured by Hamilton in the fourth. Both pitched excellent ball. Hedgepeth fanned 14 and allowed only two hits. Demott fanned 12 and allowed 2 hits. Captain Stewart went in for Hedge the in seventh after two men had walked, but Lafayette found him for two hits which combined with Carolina's errors gave the Northerners the game. A final run was added by Lafayette in the 9th thru Carolina's error. The game was fast and snappy, the work of Duncan being the feature.
