## YACKETY YACK STIPULATIONS.

The following stipulations entere into between the Dialectic and Philanthropic Societies and the Fraternities of the University of North Carolina shall, beginning with the Year 1910 11, govern the Yackety Yack until su perseded by other stipulations agreed to between said Societies and Fraternities.
Art 1. The Board of Editors shal consist of three men from each society and one from each recognized academi fraternity.
Art 2. Sec. 1. There shall be one Editor-in-Chief and two Business Managers.
Sec. 2. Their selection shall be made according to the present order of rotation among the two Literary Societies aud the Fraternities.
Art 3. Each member of the Board shall be a member of one of the academic classes at the time of his election, provided that the Editor-in-Chief and the two Business Managers shall a the time of their election, be member of the Junior or Senior class of th academic department.
Art 4. The Editor-in-Chief shal have been a member of the Yackety Yack Board at some time previous t being elected as Editor-in-Chief.
Art. 5. There shall be an Advisory Committee consisting of two members of the faculty and the Editor-in Chief who shall approve all contracts and all disbursements of money.
Art. 6. The two faculty members of this committee shall be permanent, and shall be elected by the Yacket Yack Board. The Editor-in-Chie shall be ex-officio a member of thi committee
Art. 7. The price of the Yackety Yack shall be $\$ 2.50$ each.
Art 8. The Board of Editors shall have the right to pass on all materia that goes into the Yackety Yack.
Art. 9. The Yackety Yack Board shall have thirty three votes which shall be distributed as follows: EaCh of the Societies and the Fraternities shall have ten votes each, and the two Business Managers and the Editor-in Chief one vote each.
