WHEN the TAR HEEL is late coming out, of course the editors are blamed for the delay. But so long as the typesetters insist on dropping work and having a spree at the busiest and most unseasonable times, we are helpless to get out the paper.

The TAR HEEL is able to come out today only because the lights were on last night until 3 o'clock and one of the associate editors, who understands the print-shop end of the business, out of the kindness of his heart, worked until then getting the paper ready for press.

SOME time ago the President announced in the chapel that the senior class would be allowed to decide whether or not a Phi Beta Kappa address would be given at next commencement. The only reason for discontinuing this feature of the commencement exercises is the fact that heretofore the attendance has not been worthy of the occasion and the speaker. It was arranged to have this address on Class Day, it is said, in order to furnish something of a more general interest than the usual class exercises. The advantage of this is evident. It seems that the senior class, of all concerned, would be the most unwilling to see any change made in the program. To hear the Phi Beta Kappa address, always delivered by some distinguished scholar, is a rare opportunity in itself. It is, furthermore, a merited recognition of our Phi Beta Kappa men.

All that is asked of the seniors is that they express themselves in favor of the address, if they want it next commencement, and to attend when it is given. Last year, an intermission having been given after the class exercises, a large part of the students of all classes and of the entire audience failed to return to the chapel. They thus missed the incomparable address by Dr. Phelps, and caused the question to be raised as to the advisability of continuing this feature of the program. When a distinguished man is invited to speak at commencement the students, and especially those of the senior class, are expected to be interested enough to attend. It will be a reflection on the class if this matter is passed over in indifference by them and the address is left off the program. It is to be hoped that some action will be taken soon by the seniors, as a body, in favor of having the Phi Beta Kappa address.

It is a fact worthy of note that four of the men who won N. C. sweaters this year are members of the freshman class. This seems to bear out the reputation of this class for unusual physical development and strength. It is significant, also, for its possible bearing of football. It means that a good number of trained football men will likely be available for the team several years.

WHILE our football season cannot be called successful, counting the scores, it is gratifying to know that the Athletic Association has not suffered in a financial way. In this respect, in fact, the season was as prosperous as could well be expected.

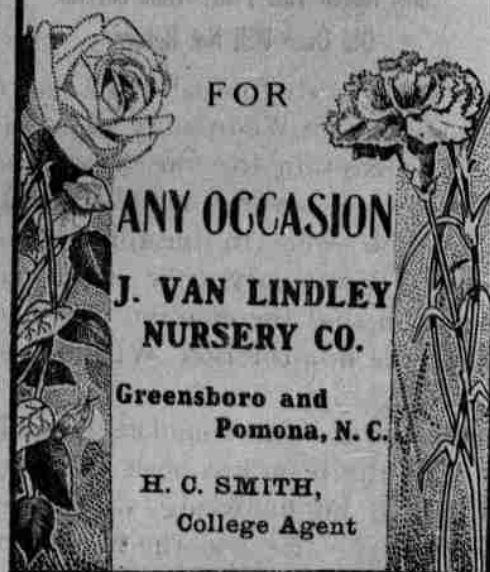
