All that is asked of the seniors is that they express themselves in favor of the address, if they want it next commencement, and to attend when it is given. Last year, an intermission having been given after the class exercises, a large part of the students of all classes and of the entire audience failed to return to the chapel. They thus missed the incomparable address by Dr. Phelps, and caused the question to be raised as to the advisability of continuing this feature of the pro-Phi Beta Kappa address.

IT is a fact worthy of note that four of the men who won N. C. sweaters this year are members of the freshman class. This seems to bear out the reputation of this class for unusual physical development and strength. It is significant, also, for its possible bearing of football. It means that a good number of trained football men will likely be available for the team several years.

WHILE our football season cannot be called successful, counting the scores, it is gratifiying to know that the Athletic Association has not suffered in a financial way. In this respect, in fact, the season was as prosperous as could well be expected.

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
