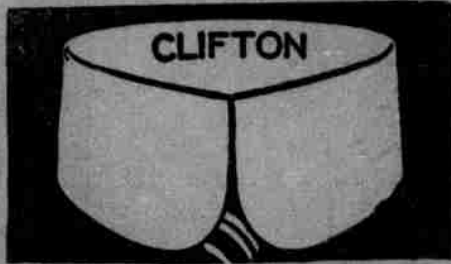
President Stryker of Hamilton College is being put forward by Princeton alumni to fill Woodrow Wilson's place at Princeton.
