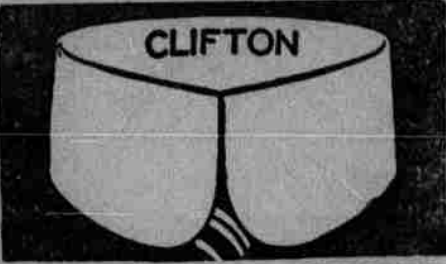
John Lowlow Dead

John Lowlow, once a University of North Carolina student, and the most noted clown in America, is dead. He joined John Robinson's show when 16 years of age and remained until old. "After retiring from the ring," says Fairbrothers' Everything, "he became press agent, and it was as press agent

that newspaper men generally learned to know him and love him. Lowlow was an educated man; attended the University of North Carolina; was brilliant and entertaining always. He told us the last time we saw him, a couple of years ago, that he had received as high as \$250 a week doing stunts in Madison Square Garden during the winter season; but that clowns now-a-days were mere hired men, cheap skates who worked for a few dollars a week. Lowlow always made local hits that the town remembered and quoted for weeks and even years after the circus was gone."
