Kamsdell is a great sprinter, in addition to his worth as a gridiron star. He is rated along with the best in the East as a 220-yard and quarter-mile man.

"The records of these fellows-and there are others—who have made good in the East go to show that, after all, there is little to choose between the leading exponents of the game in the South and their more fortunate brothers of the East. It at least lends weight to the arguments of those who contend that, practically every season, there are players in the South who would come in for strong consideration for all-American honors if they happened to be members of some prominent Eastern team."
