**CAROLINA DEFEATS PENNSYLVANIA**

American plan of public owner-  
ship and private operation.

In support of his argument for  
Federal control he brought for-  
ward the points that separate  
States have not the money with  
which to carry on the policy of  
conservation, and that the selfish  
attitude of the States would  
cause them to enact tax laws  
favoring individuals. He made  
a forcible and telling speech.

The second speaker for the  
negative was Mr. F. P. Barker.  
He sought to defend the applica-  
tion of the democratic principle  
as advanced by his colleague to  
the question under discussion, and  
to prove that the plan of feudal  
and fraternal possession of prop-  
erty as advanced by his opponents  
could not stand the test of practi-  
cal application. He spoke in  
part as follows:

"The burden of proof to justify  
this change in our plan of gov-  
ernment rests on our opponents.  
They must prove three things:  
(1) That the democratic princi-  
ple of individual ownership of  
property is wrong. (2) That the  
proposed paternal plan or the  
proposed plan for federal leases  
of these lands will be the most  
effective way for the conservation  
of the lands. (3) That the evils  
which have wrecked other at-  
tempts to plant foreign principles  
in our government will not be  
present in this attempt.

"The proposed plan is freight-  
ed with evils. It means the union  
of business and politics. It is in  
our government has never brought  
ought but disaster. The govern-  
ment has never run any business  
successfully; it cannot do so here.

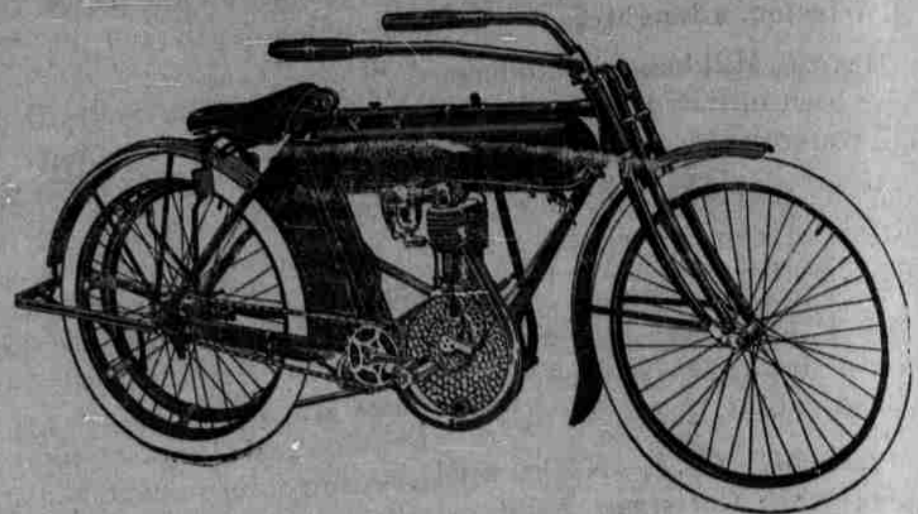
"Two practical difficulties stand  
in the way of the application of  
these plans. In the first place,  
the non-proximity of the govern-  
ment to the lands needing conser-  
vation renders the government an  
ineffective serving agent. And  
in the second place, three-fourths  
of the lands are in private pos-  
session now. The government  
cannot get this large amount of  
land. The possession of these  
lands by the government would  
deprive the people of the right to  
settle thereon and build a nation

"The individual possessor of  
property is the only effective and  
universal conserver of property.  
That the individual will conserve  
is a certainty. In the past he  
has not, but now his very sense  
of personal need, of self-preserva-  
tion will cause him to do it. The  
individual, conserving his own  
property, reaping the benefits of  
his own labor, will conserve,  
knowing that the conservation is  
profitable.

"Conservation cannot be pro-  
moted by the federal possession  
of property. The government is  
a policeman, not a conserver.  
Conservation can only be pro-  
moted by scientific invention and the  
application of scientific principles.  
Waste occurs not in the mines,  
but in the smelter, the oven, the  
fire-box. Conservation depends  
not on federal possession of land,  
but on the teaching of the indi-  
vidual to conserve and on the ad-  
vancement of scientific invention."

At a meeting of the Senior  
class Friday afternoon it was de-

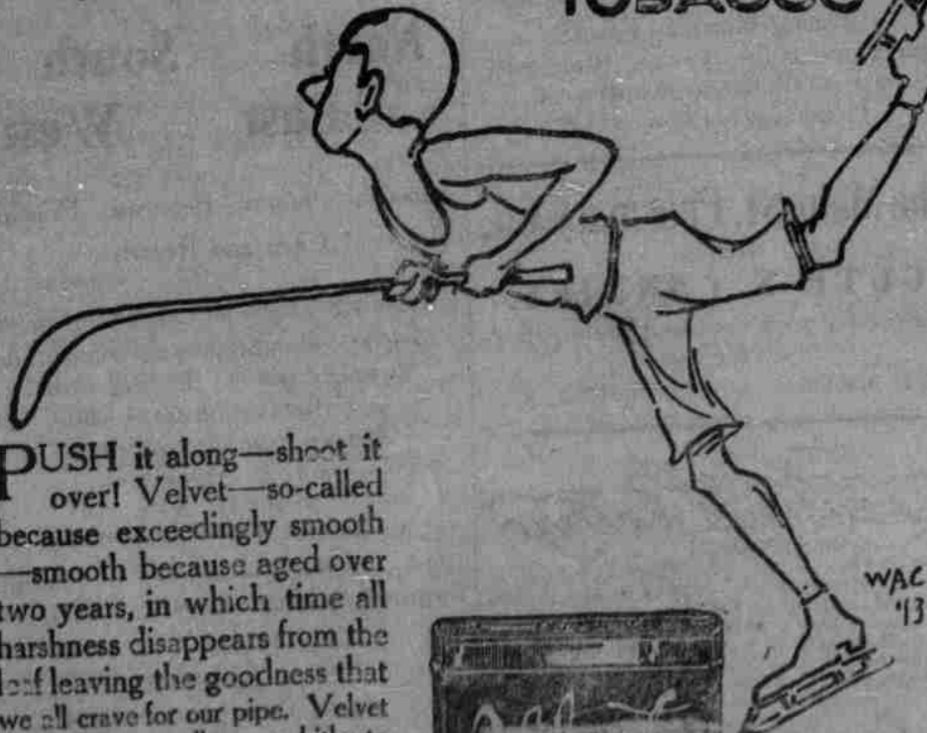
