With a shock of surprised sorrow the students of the University heard President Francis P. Venable announce in the chapel Friday morning the death of ex-Governor Charles B. Aycock. During the few minutes of the chapel hour the president spoke feelingly of the great loss which the University, the State and the nation sustains in the passing of Governor Aycock. He referred to the magnificent services which Governor Aycock rendered the people of his State and nation, and said that as Governor, Aycock had been one of the greatest and best in the history of North Carolina.

Governor Aycock graduated at the University in the class of 1880. With him at the University were Charles D. McIver, James Y. Joyner and Edwin A. Alderman, all of whom have become leaders in education in this and other states. Aycock graduated with high honors, winning the Willie P. Mangum medal in oratory at commencement. Since his graduation he has been a faithful friend of and worker for the upbuilding of the University. During the noon hour today the old bell in the South building was tolled as Carolina mourned the loss of one of her greatest sons.

## Dr. Wheeler at Y. M. C. A.

Dr. A. S. Wheeler delivered last Tuesday night at the Y. M. C. A. the first of the series of lectures on "Great Reformers". His subject was Martin Luther. Dr. Wheeler was very well fitted to discuss the Life of Luther in the respect that he has made a study of this great German Reformer and has visited many of the places concerned in the history of Luther. Dr. Wheeler was assisted by Dr. Bell who threw on the screen lantern pictures of Luther and places where he lived or men and places importantly associated with Luther, such as Frederick the Wise, the door on which were nailed the famous ninety-five theses, and the castle in which Luther translated the Bible while held a prisoner. The lecture was a very instructive review of the life of the great German Reformer.

To Amherst goes the honor of giving Raymond his first defeat as pitcher on the Varsity team. One bad inning in which Amherst coupled four hits with one wild throw caused Lee to lose 5 to 3. Up to the eighth inning he held the Northerners to four scattered hits, but in the eighth he gave a base on balls, made one error, and allowed four hits, all of which combined netted four runs. The result of this one inning was probably as much a surprise to Amherst as it was to Carolina's rooters.

Because of recent rains the diamond was in poor shape. In addition a high wind blew throughout the game and made fast fielding difficult. The game was not, however, without its thrillers. Amherst's entire infield, especially Parkenheimer and Burt, did classy work. Vernon pitched steadily and fielded well. The best play of the game came in the fourth, when with one on Hanes made a catch of Parkenheimer's drive, threw to first, and completed a fast double.

The runs came in the first, second, seventh, and eighth:

First; Amherst: Kimbal out pitcher to first. Fitts drives one for three bases. Parkenheimer sacrifices. Bailey to Whitaker, Fitts scoring. Burt out to Whitaker.

Carolina: Out in order. Score, Amherst 1, N. C. 0.

Second; Amherst: Out in order, Vernon on a fly to left, Williamson and Strahan fanning.

Carolina: Swink singled. Page sacrificed him to second. Lee hit to third who threw wild to the plate, Swink scoring. Whitaker fouled out to third. Young out second to first. Score, Amherst 1, N. C. 1.

Seventh, Amherst: Out in order.

Carolina: Lee safe on error of Swasey. Whitaker forced Lee at second. Young flew out to third. Bailey singled scoring Whitaker. Hanes flew out to short. Score, Amherst 1, N. C. 2.

Eighth; Amherst: Williamson and Swasey singled. Strahan beat out a bunt. De Castro singled scoring Williamson and Swasey. Kimball bunted and on Lee's wild throw. De Castro and Strahan scored. Fitts popped up to Lee. Parkenheimer fanned; Burt walked. Vernon out pitcher to first.

Carolina: Edwards out third to first. Irby safe on Burt's error. Swink singled. Page singled scoring Irby, Swink caught at third. Lee flew out to left. Score, Amherst 5, N. C. 3.
