in that city devoted himself to private teaching and lecturing until his death in 1894. His interest in colonial affairs was aroused, and as a result through his influence, the monument to the heroes of the Maryland Line was erected on Guilford Battle Field. He also organized a company for the purchase and preservation of Fort Raleigh on Roanoke Island.

The second gift to the library was the presentation by Hon. Richard Battle, '54, treasurer of the Board of Trustees, of six hundred volumes from his law library. The books are given to the library for the use of the Law Department. The gift contains a full set of North Carolina Reports and United States Supreme Court Reports, a number of North Carolina laws and journals, English Reports, and many treatises on torts, claims, etc.

The gift is but another one of the many and valuable services Mr. Battle has rendered his Alma Mater.

Amphoteröthen.

"Some failures of the Public Schools in North Carolina" was the theme of the discussion at the Monday afternoon meeting of Amphoteröthen. The discussion hinged on the questions of attendance, compulsory education, and vocational training.
