ed goal making it 13 to 0. Wilmington again received and after advancing the ball to the middle of the field they again lost it on downs. Raleigh advanced the ball to Wilmington's thirty yard line where Bowen placed a drop kick between the uprights. The first quarter ended 16 to 0 in Raleigh's favor.

Wilmington came back strong in the second quarter and held the Capital city team without a score.

The third quarter saw Raleigh add thirteen more points to their score. Raleigh received and after a return of punts carried the ball down the field for a touchdown, Johnson making the touchdown on the prettiest fake play of the game. Wilmington then received, and after the ball had changed hands twice the Capital city boys again carried it over. Bowen is credited with the last touchdown for Raleigh, while he also added another point by kicking goal.

Wilmington's only score came in the last quarter. Wilmington kicked while on their ten yard line. Johnson of Raleigh touched it when Thompson came by like a shot and before anyone knew what had happened he had gone the entire length of the field for the Sailor's only touchdown. It was a great run.

Wilmington also came near making another touchdown earlier in the game. It happened in the same way but Bowen managed to pull Silverman down after the latter had run fifty yards and had gained within ten yards of the coveted goal line.

The work of the entire Raleigh team was the outstanding feature at all times. The playing of Bowen, Mills, Johnson, and Champion was great. The defense of the Raleigh line was good. The best players on the Sailor Crew were Thompson and the two Silvermans.

"Guy" Phillips, former University student, has had complete charge of the Raleigh team the past season while H. S. Shaw has been coaching Wilmington. It was Wilmington's first defeat of the season.

between us and our ancient rival, the University of Virginia. The advocates of the proposed system take the view that Virginia is our chief rival—the one to be defeated as often as possible. Granting that the rules governing athletics at the two Universities should be as nearly alike as possible, the ideal standard governing athletics is that the institutions most similar should have as near as possible the same athletic regulations. It has been a noticeable fact that we in formulating athletic rules have considered, to a certain extent, the rules governing athletics not at Virginia, our chief rival, but at smaller institutions throughout our own State.

It is also noticeable that the proposed rules will serve to allay any bad feeling that might arise from any of the smaller institutions of the state, which might, at the same time, lose some member of its athletic teams by reason of one of its players having come to Carolina. Thus we can see that in that respect the proposed rules will not only do justice to ourselves but will also prevent any possible criticism from any source whatsoever.
