## N. C.--WAKE FOREST MEET

### Woolcott and Wright Break Two State Records

Carolina's track team found no difficulty in winning the track meet from Wake Forest last Saturday when the two teams met here in their annual contest. Out of the twelve events Carolina won eleven first places, ten second places and five third places, making a total of 92 points to their opponents 16.

Captain Woolcott cleared the bar in the high jump at 5 feet 9 1/2 inches and made a new state record. "Goat" Wright broke the state record in the broad jump, his new record being 22 feet 6 inches. Upchurch, a freshman, was a feature of the event. He won the two mile and then won second in the mile. Homewood won the pole vault with ease, and Davis found no trouble in taking first in the shot put.
