strong as to lead to abuses and vicious extremes, he did not think either college or intercollegiate athletics ought to be given up. Professor Corwin spoke to the point upon the subject of professionalism. He said:

In the first place it encourages the development of a few for the entertainment of many, which is undemocratic and illogical. It kills the spirit and goes back to the gladiatorial idea, eliminating from athletics all notion of recreation and physical development.

The incentive to victory is perfectly legitimate and should be present. Competition is the spice



of athletic life. The game for the game's sake would be tame and a less perfect reflection of life, without the desire to excel or the will to win.
