

**SMASHING FOOTBALL  
ENDS IN VICTORY FOR  
LIGHT TAR HEEL TEAM**  
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man was a feature of the first half for Carolina, while Pharr's brilliant leadership at quarter thruout the game has won him a place in the Tar Heel Hall of Fame. The splendid defensive work of Spaugh and his all-round steadiness when carrying the ball was another feature of the backfield. Lowe, playing for Coleman the second half, played a great offensive game and punted well. The whole substitute backfield more than met expectations.

The line, from end to end, played great ball, altho the individual work of the ends Cochrane and Proctor, of Harrell, of Pritchard, who scored on a blocked kick, of Grimes, of Robbins,—of Blount and Jacobi should be mentioned—and there you have the lot of them.

A. and E.'s backfield work was sensational at all stages, Gurley, Faucette and Hill hitting the line at times and drivethru with irresistible force.

The only man in the State College backfield who did not show excellent form was Murray, whose frequent fumbles were expensive to his team.

Homewood and Kirkpatrick, ends; Ripple and Young, tackles, played hard consistent ball in the State College line.

The work of Faucette, who made three long runs, was a feature of the backfield work.

The score by quarters follows:

**First Quarter**

Carolina receives ball on the 20 yard line. Tenney runs it up ten yards. N. C. gains 3 yards thru the line. Coleman punts the ball to A. and E.'s 25 yard line. A. and E. punts to Carolina's 40 yard line. Tenney gains 5 yards thru the line. Pharr gains 3 yards thru the line. A. and E. penalized 5 yards. 1st down for Carolina. Spaugh gains 1 yard thru line. Coleman gains 2 yards. Coleman punts behind goal. A. and E.'s ball on their 20 yard line. A. and E. punts to mid-field. Coleman runs thirty yards with ball to A. and E.'s 20 yard line. Spaugh gains 3 yards thru the line. Tenney gains 3 thru line. Coleman passes the ball over the goal line to Pharr for a touch-down. Carolina fails to kick goal. Score: N. C. 6; A. and E. 0.

A. and E. receives ball on 15 yard line. Downed 25 yard line. A. and E. gains 3 yards thru line—but fumbles. Blount recovers Carolina's ball. Carolina fails to gain. Carolina gains 2 yards. Coleman passes to Proctor. Penalized 5 yards. N. C. gains 1 yard. N. C. passes purposely to A. and E. on 5 yard line. A. and E. gains 1 yard. Sims and Woodall relieve Cochrane and Proctor. A. and E. pass fails. Dorth for Harrell. A. and E. punts. N. C. returns to 20 yard line. No gain on 1st. N. C. gains 7 thru line. N. C. gains 1 thru line. Pass fails. A. and E.'s ball on 15 yard line. Pass fails. Pass fails. N. C. penalized. 1st down for A. and E. Faucette runs 30 yards but is downed by Pharr. A. and E. passes but for 9 yards, first down. Tenney gains four yards thru the line. Spaugh gains 1/2 yard. Pass fails. Tenney fails in drop kick. A. and E.'s ball on 25 yard line. A. and E. loses 3 yards on end run. Gurley gains 6 yards around end. 7 to go. Gurley punts to N. C.'s 40 yard line. Tenney gains 5 yards thru the line. Spaugh gains 3 yards. N. C. penalized 15 yards. Tenney gains 3 yards. 25 to go. N. C. punts to Faucette who breaks loose for 50 yards. Tenney gets him on N. C.'s 25 yard line.

**Second Quarter**

A. and E. fumbles and fails to gain. A. and E. makes first down thru the line. A. and E. gains 2 yards thru the line. A. and E. gains 3 yards thru line. 10 yards to goal. Pass nets 9 yards. A. and E. drives thru line for touch-down. Kick fails. Score 6 to 6.

A. and E. receives ball on 20 yard line and rushes to 35 yard line. Gurley gains 15 yards. Hill gains 3 yards. A. and E. penalized 10 yards. 12 to go. Gurley gains 2 yards. A. and E. punts to Tenney who is downed on N. C.'s 30 yard line. N. C. fails to gain. Spaugh loses 5 yards. Coleman punts to Gurley who is downed on his forty yard line. A. and E. gains 2 1/2 yards thru line. A. and E. gains 3 1/2 yards

thru line. A. and E. gains 1 1/2 yards. A. and E. punts. N. C. blocks ball on our 45 yard line. Tenney loses 8 yards. Pass fails. Coleman punts to A. and E.'s 25 yard line. A. and E. fumbles. N. C.'s ball on A. and E.'s 25 yard line. Spaugh gains 1 yard thru line. Coleman passes to Cochrane for first down. Ball on A. and E.'s 15 yard line. N. C. fumbles. A. and E. recovers. A. and E. punts to N. C. on our 40 yard line. Spaugh gains 3 yards. Hardin goes in for Tenney. N. C. does not gain. Coleman punts to Gurley who is downed in tracks by Blount on 10 yard line. A. and E. punts to Hardin who is downed on our 40 yard line. Half over. Second Half

Carolina kicks off. Gurley receives ball on his ten yard line and runs 80 yards to Carolina's ten yard line. Forward pass gives touch down. A. and E. scores thru line. Fails to kick goal. Score: 12 to 6.

A. and E. receives kick off. Gurley downed on 25 yard line by Harrell. A. and E. gains 2 yards thru line. A. and E. fumbles and N. C. recovers on 35 yard line. N. C. does not gain. Cochrane gains 2 yards around end. A. and E. intercepts N. C.'s push on 35 yard line. A. and E. gains 2 yards thru line. A. and E. gains 3 yards thru line. Gurley punts but Pritchard breaks thru and blocks kick, recovering the ball on the 25 yard line and running for a touch-down. N. C. kicks goal. Score: 13 to 12.

A. and E. receives and is downed on 31 yard line. A. and E. gains 3 yards thru line. A. and E. gains 1 yard thru line. Ball goes over on downs.

**Fourth Quarter**

N. C.'s ball on our 40 yard line. N. C. does not gain. N. C. no gain. Lowe punts and A. and E. returns to 30 yard line. Gant goes in for Pritchard. A. and E. gains 2 yards. A. and E. tries pass which Blount intercepts on forty yard line. N. C. gains 2 yards. Lowe passes to Cochrane for 15 yards. Griffith gains two yards. Lowe gains 3. Pass fails. Lowe to Spaugh. Lowe punts outside on A. and E.'s 40 yard line. A. and E. gains 8 around end. A. and E. gains 2. 1st down. Ball mid-field. A. and E. gains five yards. A. and E. fumbles. Harrell recovers for N. C. Our ball mid-field. Proctor around end for 4 yards. Lowe punts, and A. and E. back waits to let ball roll out. Ball inside. A. and E.'s ball on their 5 yard line. A. and E. punts to N. C. who returns ball to A. and E.'s 30 yard line. N. C. gains 2 yards. N. C. gains 1 1/2 yards. Pass fails. Lowe passes, Gurley intercepts and is downed on his fifteen yard line. A. and E. gains 3 yards. A. and E. gains 1 yard. A. and E. punts. N. C.'s ball mid-field. Lowe loses 2. Spaugh gains 9. Griffith gains 1. N. C. punts. A. and E. returns to 20 yard line. Jacobi for Blount. A. and E. fumbles. N. C.'s ball on 20 yard line. N. C. gains 1 yard. N. C. fails. N. C.'s ball. Fumbles, Gurley recovering on 30 yard line. A. and E. passes for 15 yards. A. and E. gains 4 yards. Smith for Pharr. A. and E. passes—fails—A. and E. passes—fails. Gurley runs 20 yards and is downed by Smith. A. and E. passes—fails—A. and E. passes—fails. A. and E. tries drop kick which fails, Lowe running ball up to 30 yard line. Mobly for Smith. Time.
