#### GRADUATE STUDENTS MAKE SCHOOL SURVEY

Mr. H. F. Latshaw and Mr. E. W. Lohr, a former student in the Graduate School, and used the opportunity to try out the preliminary arrangement of that test with the three upper

classes in Latin in the high school. The results of this survey will be made public during this school year and it is the purpose of the School of Education to publish the results as a bulletin of the University sometime this spring.
