

(Continued From Page One) Near the end of the first half Griffin carried the ball well into South Caro lina's territory. Just before the whistle blew he intercepted a pass and in two plays carried the ball over the goal line.

During the second half line plays were generally unsuccessful, so the punting duol was renewed. Finally South Carolina made a series of first downs which carried the ball over North Carolina's goal line, South Caralina's defensive system proved to make line plays and end runs very difficult for the Tar Heels. On the offensive Boatwright made considerable gains for his team through running back the punts which he received.
