LECTURE ON ASBESTOS IS TO BE GIVEN HERE

Thursday evening at 7:30 the combined Geological and Engineering Societies will hear an illustrated lecture by a speaker from the Johns-Manville Asbestos Company. The subject of the lecture will be "The Mining and Manufacturing of Asbestos."

This is one of a series of lectures that the geology department is arranging. Other films, it is expected, will be shown later under the auspices of the United States Mining Bureau. The public is invited to attend these lectures. The pictures will be general enough in their nature to be of interest generally, and will be of especial interest to students specializing in geology or engineering.

Dr. Jas. B. Murphy, A. B. 1905, of the Rockefeller Institute of New York, continues his series of papers in the Journal of Experimental Medicine, March, April, 1922, reporting on his investigations of the effects of X-rays on lymph cells in connection with cancer.

Dr. H. S. Willis, A. B. Class of 1914, is continuing his experimental study of tuberculosis, with the support of the Kenneth Dows Tuberculosis Research Fund of the Medical Clinic of the Johns Hopkins Hospital and University. He reports on these studies in three recent papers published in the American Review of Tuberculosis.
