(Continued from first page) William S. Kenyon who favored a further trial and an amendment if it proved a failure; and Paul J. McCormick who stated "absolute repeal is unwise."

Henry W. Anderson of Richmond said that the abolition of the saloon was one of the greatest steps ever taken by the nation and added that the effort to make all people total abstainers run counter to the fundamental social and economic principles beyond the control of government. Frank J. Loesch, Kenneth Mackintosh, Roscoe Pound, and Kenyon and Mc-Cormick are all substantially behind the opinion of Anderson although differing in the degrees to which the present law should be revised.

Ada L. Comstock, the only woman member of the commission is of the opinion that the Amendment should be modified immediately but still hopes that national regulation may prove more successful.

Newton D. Baker, formerly secretary of war, is in favor of unconditional repeal of the Eighteenth Amendment, He has said, "In my opinion the be repealed and the whole question of policy and enforcement with regard to intoxicating liquors remitted to the states."
